Truman Appoints Doolittle To National Air Committee

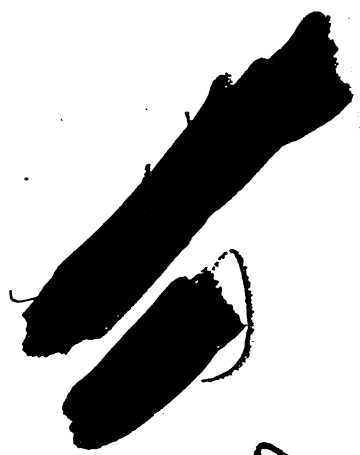

President Truman named Gen. Doolittle as one of three new appointees to the committee required by an Act of the 80th Congress.

The commander of the famed Tokyo bombers, together with a Philadelphia physicist and physiologist, Dr. Detlev W. Bronk, was appointed with terms expiring December 1, 1950. Dr. Vannevar Bush, chairman of the Research and Development Board of the National Military Establishment, became a member by reason of that chairmanship.

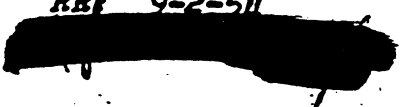

Doctor Urges Free Inquiry For Scientists

Dr. Detlev W. Bronk, president of the Rockefeller Institute of Medical Research, last night said there was no place in science for timid men who are willing to up their freedom of inquiry to reactionary forces.

Dr. Bronk expressed faith in the loyalty of American scientists to human freedom and welfare.

If scientists differ from other men, he added, it is only that their curiosity has been less extinguished. He warned against the danger that "curiosity be suppressed and conformity be required."

Dr. Bronk spoke at a dinner in the Statler Hotel, closing the annual convention of the Medical Library Association.

Earlier, the association elected this new slate of officers:

Miss Wilma Troxel, librarian of the Bio-Medical Science Library, University of Illinois, president; Wesley Draper, librarian of the Medical Society of the County of Kings, Brooklyn, vice president; Dr. E. H. Cushing, of Washington, honorary vice president; Esther Judkins, librarian of the Rockefeller Institute of Medical Research, secretary, and Pauline Duffield, librarian of the Texas Medical Society, treasurer.

Outgoing president is Marion Dondale, librarian of the Albany (N. Y.) Medical College.

The Asks Scientists Loyalty Policy Aid

The National Academy of Sciences yesterday announced the Administration has sought its help in resolving loyalty policy for the best use of the Nation's scientists.

Specifically, the announcement disclosed President Eisenhower wants advice on how to handle requests for research grants for unclassified work by scientists of questioned loyalty. The disclosure marked the first apparent admission that perhaps the Administration has gone too far in its efforts to keep the country's vast research program free of disloyalty scandals.

Couched in less revealing terms, the Administration asked the Academy "to advise the Government in the formulation of a policy to the end that the scientific resources of our country may be fully and effectively utilized."

Very little has been made public on the subject, but it is known in scientific circles, that more and more scientists who had been receiving Government research grants have been turned down when they sought new grants or continuation funds.

The rejections were never explained, officially, but the applicants were told orally—and thereby unofficially—that they hadn't passed a loyalty check.

At least one Nobel Prize winner, who had worked for years under Federal grants for research on work unrelated to the Nation's security was told, unofficially, that if his rejected renewal application was filed in his assistant's name the request for continuation funds would be approved. It was so altered, and granted.

Yesterday's announcement by Dr. Detlev W. Bronk, NAS president, didn't go into any such details. Dr. Bronk merely announced the request for help, and released an exchange of letters on the subject between Sherman Adams, Assistant to the President, and himself.

Adams asked that the Academy, the Nation's organization of top-ranking scientists, serve

as an advisory group when questions relating to loyalty are involved.

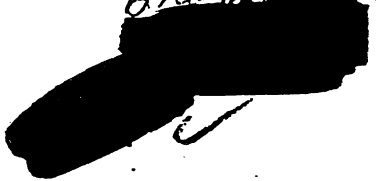
Dr. Bronk replied the Academy was prepared "to appoint a committee of scientists and others to consider the problems in question and to advise with you in the near future."

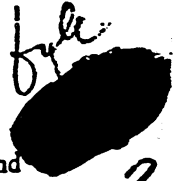

Dr. Detlev Bronk, President, National Academy of Sciences (NAS), Washington, D. C., born August 13, 1897, New York City, was subject of an applicant-type investigation by Bureau 1941 which revealed nothing derogatory. Supplemental applicant-type investigations of Bronk in 1947 and 1954 *Mc*

associate considered Bronk not suitable for responsible U. S. Government position as Bronk, while president, Johns Hopkins University, 1949-53, allegedly retained or hired faculty members of doubtful loyalty later identified with communist activities, specifically Owen Lattimore. Another associate characterized Bronk as one of a group of scientists who band together in the interest of freedom of science and do not see the dangers on questions of loyalty.

Bronk on May 17, 1949, before Congressional Joint Atomic Energy Committee, testified against FBI investigation of applicants for Atomic Energy Commission fellowships, claiming this would repress the program and interfere with free play of scientific thought.

Pauling and Bronk Are Elected To Soviet Academy of Sciences

MOSCOW, June 21—The Soviet Union awarded full membership in the Academy of Sciences today to two Americans, Dr. Linus C. Pauling and Dr. Detlev W. Bronk.

Dr. Bruno Pontecorvo, who fled to the Soviet Union from the West in 1950, was also named a corresponding member of the academy, which directs all scientific research in the Soviet Union. Dr. Pontecorvo now heads the Communist bloc's nuclear research.

Dr. Pauling, an outspoken foe of nuclear weapons tests, and Dr. Bronk were among fifty foreign scientists and scholars

to receive membership in the academy.

[Dr. Bronk commented in New York that receiving the award was something like getting an honorary degree. "You get a letter of notification and a yearbook, and that's all you hear about it," he said. In Yellow Springs, Ohio, Dr. Pauling said he was pleased and honored. "I believe in the importance of improving international relations in every way," he said. "I look forward to continuing better cooperation with the Soviet Union."

In the past, the Soviet Union has recognized outstanding work of foreign scientists through the awarding of "peace prizes." These awards usually took political factors into consideration.

The list of new academicians cut across political grounds. Observers believed the Soviet action was intended to cement nonpolitical relations between the scientists of the free and Communist worlds.

Dr. Bronk, 61 years old, is president of the Rockefeller Institute of Medical Research and is serving his third four-year term as president of the United States National Academy of Sciences. He was president of Johns Hopkins University from 1948 to 1953.

Dr. Pauling, 57, winner of the Nobel Prize in chemistry in 1954, has been a controversial political figure in the United States for years.

Campaigning against nuclear bomb tests, he brought a suit for an injunction last year in an attempt to stop United States tests held last April, naming the Department of Defense and the Atomic Energy Commission as defendants.

Soviet members of the Academy are the nation's highest paid citizens. There is no higher accolade in the Soviet Union than the title of academicien that goes with membership.

Although the official announcement was not made on the spot, it was believed Dr.

Bronk, Dr. Pauling and the other non-Soviet members would have purely honorary status in the Academy.

There was no expectation that the new members would participate in the actual work of the Academy of Sciences. The responsibilities of the Academy range from nuclear research to coordination of International Geophysical Year operations.

Three Britains and two Canadians also were appointed to membership. They include Sir Cyril Hinshelwood, president of Britain's Royal Society.

The Italian-born Dr. Pontecorvo was a leading nuclear physicist in Britain until he disappeared behind the Iron Curtain eight years ago. He is now a Soviet citizen and chief of the Soviet Joint Institute of Nuclear Research.

Pauling Explains Russ Honor

PASADENA, July 1—Dr. Linus C. Pauling, 1934 Nobel Prize California Institute of Technology chemist, said today he does not attribute his recent naming to Soviet Academy of Sciences membership to his campaigning for abandonment of nuclear tests, which also is a Soviet policy.

He and another American scientist, Physicist Detlev W. Bronk, a Rockefeller Foundation administrator, three-time National Academy of Scientists president and former Johns Hopkins University president, were among 30 chosen scientists of Russia for membership in the Soviet organization.

"I would think," Dr. Pauling said, "our selection was on the basis that we were considered to be among leading American scientists."

The new membership, he said, raises to about a dozen his affiliations with foreign scientific organizations, including those in France, England, Italy, Belgium, Japan and others.

"Membership in these scientific groups usually is proposed by some member, but I have no idea who proposed me for this one," Dr. Pauling said.

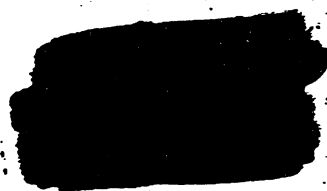
The academies hold one or more meetings annually. Dr. Bronk has been invited, Dr. Pauling said, to Moscow to confer with Soviet Academy officials this summer on exchange of scientists between this country and Russia.

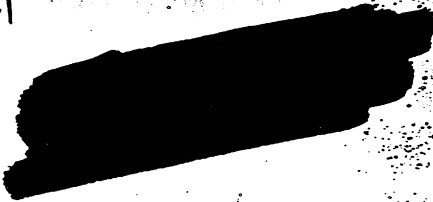
"I haven't been invited," he said.

The United States National Academy of Scientists has foreign members, he said, including two from Russia. Dr. Ernest O. Lawrence, of the University of California radiation laboratory, Berkeley, was named to the Soviet Academy in 1943, Dr. Pauling noted.

Dr. Lawrence has just been appointed by President Eisenhower to represent this country in negotiations on nuclear inspection stations, he added.




There were also included in this issue excerpts from statements by scientists attending the International Assembly of Scientists meeting in Moscow and Leningrad in celebration of the 200th Anniversary of the Academy of Scientists of the USSR. The statements, including that of Dr. DETLEV BRONK, related chiefly to their impressions of the Soviet Union.

A review of available publications of the Association of Philadelphia Scientists, an affiliate of the Federation of American Scientists disclosed, in the April, 1946, issue of the "Association of Philadelphia Scientists News," that applicant's name was included in a tentative advisory panel for the Federation of Atomic Scientists.

A newspaper clipping from the Philadelphia "Evening Bulletin" dated October 14, 1946, states that DETLEV W. BRONK, of the National Academy of Sciences and Coordinator of Research for the Army Air Forces Medical Section during the war, had been named as one of ten scientists as members of a civilian research advisory committee.

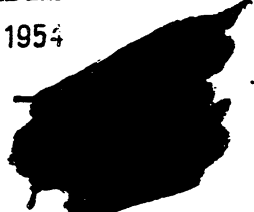

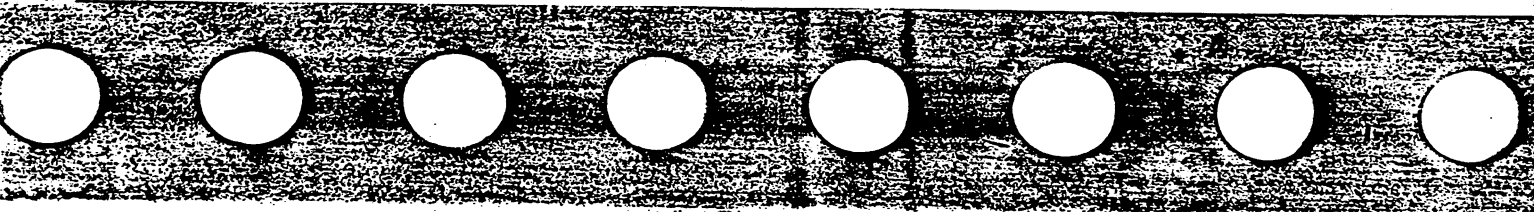

The January, 1949 issue of "The Bulletin of Atomic Scientists", published by the Atomic Scientists of Chicago, Chicago, Illinois, reflects that one DETLEV W. BRONK, not otherwise identified, was a member of that organization's Board of Sponsors.

The December, 1948 issue of "The Bulletin of Atomic Scientists" discloses that DETLEV W. BRONK, President, John Hopkins University, was one of the Bulletin's sponsors.

Information Concerning
"The Bulletin of Atomic Scientists"

An examination of past issues of "The Bulletin of Atomic Scientists" reflected that it was first published by the Atomic Scientists of Chicago and the first issue was dated December 10, 1945. "The Bulletin of Atomic Scientists" in its statements has been generally unfavorable to Communism and to the Soviet Union.

Examination of "The Bulletin of Atomic Scientists" showed that it has advocated the following:

1. Civilian control of atomic energy, and international control of atomic energy with safeguards.
2. Reduction of secrecy pertaining to atomic energy and other scientific matters insofar as this is consistent with the national welfare.
3. That the atomic bomb is not really a secret and that Russia's position has been generally criticized but it has consistently been stated that the United States must keep on trying to achieve international control of atomic energy.
4. Fellowships of unclassified nuclear study should not be subject to FBI investigation and further that claims have been made that the civil rights of scientists are not properly protected.

Information Concerning Atomic
Scientists of Chicago

It is noted that the Manhattan Engineering District, Chicago, Illinois, in 1946 advised that the Atomic Scientists of Chicago grew out of meetings held at the Metallurgical Laboratory of the Atomic Energy Project at the University of Chicago beginning

in June, 1945. These meetings, officially sanctioned by the officials of the Atomic Energy Project in Chicago, were referred to as political and social implication meetings and dealt with the political and social phases of the atomic bomb. The immediate objectives at that time were stated to be:

1. International control of atomic energy with a view of eventually having world government.
2. To study and make recommendations on a national policy relating to atomic power and research.

It is also noted that the Atomic Scientists of Chicago have stressed that scientists should have a privilege of making public statements pertaining to the atomic bomb and atomic energy where technical data is not involved. Also stressed was that the actual secrets of the atomic bomb are trivial and processing secrets of the atomic bomb are not really secrets.

The constitution of the Atomic Scientists regarding the purposes of the organization reflected as follows:

1. Explore, classify and formulate the opinions and responsibilities of scientists in regard to the problems brought about by the release of Nuclear Energy.
2. Educate the public to full understanding of the scientific, technical and political problems arising from the release of Nuclear Energy.
