Dr. Bronk has been the recipient of numerous doctor's degrees and he serves on the board of trustees of several institutions of learning and scientific organizations. In 1956 he was the recipient of the Priestly Award of Dickinson College, Carlisle, Pennsylvania. This award is given yearly to an outstanding scientist, who is selected by the Priestly Jury, composed of members of the Dickinson College faculty and outstanding alumni of the college who have distinguished themselves in the field of science.

Dr. Bronk entered on duty as an ensign in the United States Navy on December 21, 1918, and was released from active duty as an ensign on February 12, 1919. He served as an ensign in the United States Naval Reserve Forces from February 12, 1919, to May 14, 1922, when he was honorably discharged. His service record is clear.

Since that time he has had considerable social and professional contact with Dr. Bronk and considers him a close personal friend. He said Dr. Bronk is one of the "top" men in the field of science and is a person whose character, associates, reputation, and loyalty are above reproach. He favorably recommended Dr. Bronk for a position of trust and confidence.

He noted that this post represents the highest honor that the field of science can offer to one of its members.

[REDACTED] Rockefeller Brothers Fund, New York City, furnished comments concerning Dr. Bronk during the 1954 investigation. His comments are contained on pages 9 and 10 of the 1954 summary memorandum. He stated at that time he felt Dr. Bronk's interest in academic freedom may have colored his political outlook and judgment in supporting Owen Lattimore's continued service on the faculty of Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, Maryland, although Dr. Bronk was cognizant of the allegations levied against Owen Lattimore. During the current inquiry [REDACTED] he considers Dr. Bronk one of the most practical members of his, Dr. Bronk's, profession. He said that his association with Dr. Bronk since Dr. Bronk assumed the Presidency of the Rockefeller Institute for Medical Research in 1953 has altered his opinion and he now feels Dr. Bronk would be practical and would exercise proper judgment in evaluating security matters affecting the national interest. [REDACTED] in 1958 Dr. Bronk was elected to membership in the U.S.S.R. Academy of Sciences, but Dr. Bronk did not accept membership in that organization. He furnished favorable comments concerning Dr. Bronk's character, reputation, and loyalty, and recommended Dr. Bronk for a position of trust and confidence with the United States Government.

[REDACTED] whose comments concerning Dr. Bronk are contained on pages 13 to 15 of the 1954 summary memorandum; when contacted during the current inquiry stated that the comments made by him in 1954 concerning Dr. Bronk still apply, and he has no additional information concerning him.

[REDACTED] Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, Maryland, whose comments concerning Dr. Bronk are contained on pages 16 and 17 of the 1954 summary memorandum, was contacted during the current inquiry. He stated that the comments made by him in 1954 concerning Dr. Bronk are still applicable and he has no additional information to furnish.

Thirty-two additional persons, consisting of social acquaintances and professional associates, furnished favorable comments concerning Dr. Bronk's character, reputation, loyalty, and associates. Dr. Bronk's professional associates stated he is an outstanding scientist who has earned world-wide acclaim in his profession. Dr. Bronk was recommended highly for a position of trust and responsibility.

The records of the National Academy of Sciences and National Research Council show that Dr. Bronk was granted a "Top Secret" clearance on January 25, 1955, and this clearance is presently active.

The records of the Passport Office, Department of State, show that the passport issued to Dr. Bronk on August 14, 1952, was revalidated on September 29, 1955, for travel to Europe in connection with official Government business. He was issued a passport on September 17, 1957, for travel to Germany on official business of the United States Government. This passport was renewed on June 20, 1960, for travel to Europe to attend a conference as President of the National Academy of Sciences.

Information has been received from the Investigations Division, Civil Service Commission; House Committee on Un-American Activities; Office of Special Investigations, Department of the Air Force; Office of Naval Intelligence; Office of Civil and Defense Mobilization; Department of Health, Education, and Welfare; and G-2, United States Army Counterintelligence Records Facility, Fort Holabird, Maryland, indicating that their files contain either no record or no additional pertinent information concerning Dr. Bronk.

The "Washington Post and Times Herald," a daily newspaper published at Washington, D. C., in its issue of June 22, 1958, contained an article captioned, "Soviet Academy of Sciences Admits Two Leading U. S. Research Experts." The article stated that Dr. Bronk was one of two United States scientists in 1958 who were elected to full membership in the U.S.S.R. Academy of Sciences. The article continued that this was a "precedent-breaking action." It was stated in the article that appointment to membership in the U.S.S.R. Academy of Sciences would be tantamount to the award of an honorary university degree in the West. Persons interviewed during this inquiry advised that Dr. Bronk did not accept membership in the U.S.S.R. Academy of Sciences.

The central files of the Federal Bureau of Investigation contain no additional pertinent information.

SEVENTEEN years ago, while commanding his 45-foot Norwegian sloop, the King Haakon, in a 400-mile race to Halifax, N. S., Dr. Detlev Wulf Bronk found a way of maintaining uninterrupted productivity as president of both the National Academy of Sciences and the Rockefeller Institute. Dr. Bronk arranged for his executive assistant, Mrs. Mabel E. Bright, to climb aboard at Marblehead, Mass., with a typewriter and a pound of anti-seasick pills.

When calm settled the heaving sea and stilled the wind, the skipper lowered his voice to executive range and dictated answers to letters. He didn't win the race, but neither did he face a stack of waiting mail when he came off the water.

The world has rained honors upon Dr. Bronk. Yesterday he became heir to a new, if modest, distinction. Joseph F. Periconi, Borough President of the Bronx, made Dr. Bronk of Manhattan honorary chairman of the Bronx Golden Jubilee Executive Committee. He is a direct descendant of Jonas Bronck, for whom the county was named.

Dr. Bronk Sc. D., D. Med. Sc., D. Litt., LL. D. (and 38 other degrees), lives in the Rockefeller Institute's \$600,000 president's residence. It is a modern, 10-room, one-level town house with a severely plain stone and glass exterior and a view of the East River. The house is tucked into the northeast corner of the 14-acre campus, which is on a pleasant rise overlooking the river, 145 feet above York Avenue at its 68th Street summit.

Lately Dr. Bronk has warned that the world-renowned institute would have to leave New York if a subway tunnel to Queens were built under 64th Street. He said the vibrations of construction and subway transit would affect delicate instruments in its laboratories.

Three Sailor Sons

Dr. Bronk married Helan A. Ramsay in 1921 and they have three adult sons who are also expert sailors.

He was born in this city on Aug. 13, 1897. His father was a Baptist minister who held pastorates in New York, Massachusetts and New Jersey.

After a year-long hitch with the Naval Aviation Corps, Dr. Bronk embarked on an academic course that led him to neurophysiology and biophysics.

Dr. Bronk, a former president of the Johns Hopkins University, likes to spend

...ual, has always been enormous. In 1962 he reached Washington on the long flight from Japan in time for an afternoon meeting. Then he flew to New York in time for the Christmas ball at the institute and whirled around the dance floor until after midnight. Then he spent a couple of hours chatting with students.

In a mad-paced world, Dr. Bronk has articulated the need to preserve "the precious intimacy of relation between a scholar" and students.

Since taking over in 1953 he has changed the institute from a medical research center with no direct teaching function to a community of research scholars that is also a graduate university. It has 97 students (called research fellows) and 291 faculty members — a ratio of 1 to 3.

He has pledged the institute to the "furtherance of excellence and not numbers." It confers its sole degree — doctor of philosophy — on, at most, 15 persons a year.

Dr. Bronk spends his mornings reading at home, where he will not be disturbed. In the forenoon he walks a few hundred feet to his huge, high-ceilinged office and sits at a drawerless walnut desk (it is actually one-third of the board of directors' table) and refuses to run his appointments on a tight, fixed schedule.

"The style is unhurried," an associate said. "He handles each one as it comes, giving as long as it takes to resolve the matter, even if it's an hour or more."

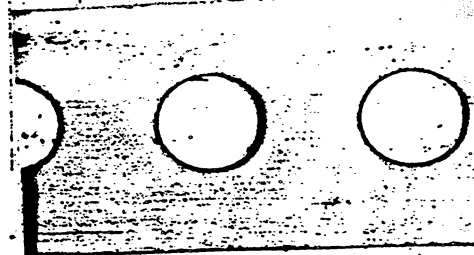
Dr. Bronk retired in 1962 after serving three four-year terms as head of the National Academy of Sciences.

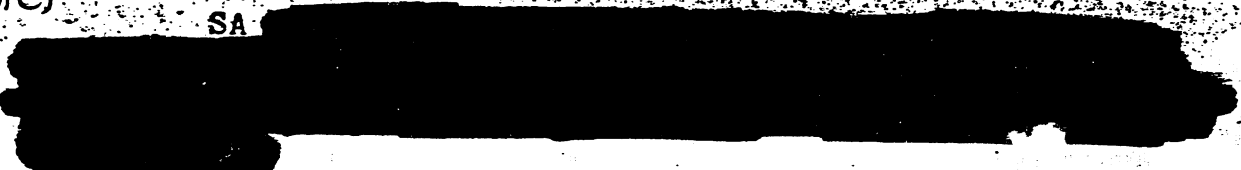
