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PROFESSOR THEODORE VON KARMAN  
University Aeronautics, Pasadena, Calif.

Information is available that he is a Hungarian Jew, who first entered the United States in October, 1926, and since that time, has made numerous trips between the United States and Europe. It was reported in May, 1941, that von Karman's sister, who lives with him, has declared herself to be a Nazi sympathizer on many occasions, and does not try to hide the fact that she is in favor of the Nazi cause. Von Karman is presently under investigation by this Bureau, along with two other individuals, all of whom are suspected of being engaged in espionage activities. (65-8943-46)

The duplicate copy of Form OH is being returned herewith.



Other information advised that Von Karman was entirely reliable and was anti-Nazi in sympathy. It has been reported that a number of marked maps of the TVA and various other bridges were discovered in the davenport taken from the home of one Theodore Von Karman, who at that time was residing at 1501 South Marango Street, Pasadena, California. In this same connection, it was stated that this individual had been called in by the Federal Government as an expert on stresses and strains after the collapse of the Takoma Bridge in Washington, and that he had made a survey of all suspension bridges in this country for the government. There is conflicting evidence as to whether or not this individual is on friendly terms with one Alexander Goetz of California, concerning whom considerable derogatory information is available indicating pro-German sympathies.

Information made available indicates that Von Karman, on December 19, 1940, wrote to an individual of German extraction who was suspected of having engaged in espionage activities in this country.

Confidential information is available that Von Karman corresponded on January 10, 1941, with an individual suspected of having engaged in espionage activities.

On January 12, 1942, information was made available that an anonymous telephone call at Los Angeles, California reported that approximately one year before a man by the name of T. Kodama had contacted the informant relative to a business transaction. Kodama advised that he was employed by a Dr. Theodore Von Karman, who was an airplane designer for the United States Government and a Professor at the California Institute of Technology. The informant further advised that this individual displayed a picture of his employer, Dr. Theodore Von Karman, dressed in a robe which bore a large swastika thereon.

Information received in June of 1942 from Los Angeles, California, advises that Theodore Von Karman has had a Japanese in his employ as a chauffeur, gardener and general handy man. Information is available that this individual is a Japanese named Podajiro Kodama and that he is reported to be a structural engineer who could read drawings and blueprints. According to this information, this individual has in the past had access to various blueprints and drawings which Von Karman had in his possession. Kodama, according to this information, has been removed from the Los Angeles area and is no longer in the employ of Von Karman.

**SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:**

THEODORE VON KARMAN was probably furnished with an old style identification pass of the War Department Air Corps Material Division, Wright Field, Ohio, which pass would take him under present regulations only to the information desk at the field, or any other air corps field, where he would be required to furnish further identification. VON KARMAN has worked at Wright Field on research problems in the aircraft laboratory wind tunnel.

**SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:** THEODORE VON KARMAN, Professor of Aeronautics, California Institute of Technology is alleged to be a Hungarian Jew and very much opposed to Nazi Government. Dr. SPIRO KYROPOULOS, a Research Fellow in Physics at CIT recently submitted plans or specifications of a military nature to some U.S. Government department. Although KYROPOULOS thought this transaction confidential, ALEXANDER GOETZ, Departmental Head at CIT, admonished KYROPOULOS for not taking the matter up with him before submitting it to government. GOETZ is native of Prussia, and thought to be Nazi sympathizer, although he does not express beliefs. GOETZ is close friend of Salesman for Adolph Frese Corp., Los Angeles.

is native of Germany who sells heat regulators and thermometers which are used by aircraft manufacturers.

and has gone out of his way to disclaim German affiliations. Although there are several foreign Teaching Fellows in Aeronautics Department at CIT, it is not known whether they have access to the wind tunnel or confidential information obtained therefrom. advised it is his belief that the wind tunnel at CIT is closely guarded against unauthorized admittance - this belief being substantiated by Pasadena, California, student at CIT.

DETAILS: The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent

Pasadena, California,  
advised the Los Angeles  
Division by letter dated November 15, 1939 of the following information:

had received information that a Dr. SPIRO KYROPOULOS, a Research Fellow in Physics at the California Institute of Technology, Pasadena, recently submitted certain plans or specifications of a military nature to some United States Government department. Although this transaction was confidential, Dr. KYROPOULOS was astonished a few days later to find that Dr. COETZ, head of one of the departments at Cit, knew of this transaction. COETZ is alleged to have admonished KYROPOULOS for not taking the matter up with him before submitting it to the Government.

KYROPOULOS took his degree in Physics at the University of Leipzig, and came to this country in 1937

KYROPOULOS is alleged to have been an engineer in the German submarine service during the first World War. In this same letter furnished the names of the following who are alleged to be pro-Nazi - the comments or are quoted:

JOE CASPROWLACK, "40, definitely pro-Nazi. Lives at hotel. In U.S. about 12 yrs. Works as Flower Boy. Amateur photographer."

"age unknown, has final citizenship papers, works in Flower Room, pro-Nazi, known as Amateur photographer."

"age unknown, no papers, known as possible pro-Nazi."

"age unknown, possible pro-Nazi."

"age unknown, has citizenship papers, married, supposed to be active in, if not head of, local Bund."

"age unknown, no papers, possible pro-Nazi."

Upon interview advised that he has studied at the California Institute of Technology for the past years, and is personally acquainted with the majority of professors at that

institution. He stated that Dr. THEODORE VON KARMAN, Head of the Aeronautics Department at CIT, bears the reputation of being definitely anti-Nazi. said that

who is presently at CIT, is very anti-Nazi; that recently advised him that VON KARMAN is a Hungarian Jew, and that on several occasions he has assisted in aiding Jewish refugees in leaving Germany. According to VON KARMAN resides at 1501 South Morengo Avenue, Pasadena, with his sister; and his description is as follows:

stated that VON KARMAN is a close friend of the actress, and that he has never heard anything which would indicate that he is sympathetic toward the Nazi Government.

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further advised that the information which he had received relative to ALEXANDER GOETZ criticizing KYROPOULOS for sending his specifications or plans of military value to one of the departments of the United States Government at Washington, D.C. - was obtained from

stated that he would keep in touch with and endeavor to develop an acquaintance with KYROPOULOS in an effort to obtain definite information relative to what plans or specifications he submitted to the government; and further to learn how GOETZ obtained the information that the plans had been submitted. stated that while GOETZ is very close-mouthed about his political views, he is thought to be a Nazi sympathizer.

further stated that quite some time ago.

is connected with the Soviet Embassy at is now in Washington, D.C., employed in one of the governmental departments as a physicist.

stated that advised him that GOETZ is a Prussian, and was having difficulty with the Nazi Government when he left Germany. However, after arriving in the United States, GOETZ made definite efforts to obtain the good will of the Nazi Government and is undoubtedly pro-Nazi in his sympathies at the present time.

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stated that the wind tunnel at CIT is used by all of the local manufacturers of airplanes to test out models, both commercial and those being manufactured for the Army and Navy; that immediately above the wind tunnel there are several computing rooms where the confidential data relative to the performance of the planes in the wind tunnel are recorded; and even though a person did not obtain access to the wind tunnel, if he could obtain the confidential data relative to the plane's performance he would undoubtedly have a great deal of valuable information concerning the new models. stated that he understood that a great deal of care is exercised by the officials of CIT in order to prevent students from gaining entrance to the wind tunnel and computing rooms. However, he stated, all the professors in the Aeronautics Department, and Research Fellows, could probably gain access to the wind tunnel.

stated that the catalog for the CIT reflects that BASIL PETROVICH MANTONENKO is a Teaching Fellow in the Aeronautics Department, and that he is from the Petersburg School of Naval Aviation - probably Russia. Further that the catalog shows JOHN SHOICHI ATSUMI is a Teaching Fellow and Assistant in the Aeronautics Department at CIT; that he has a BS degree from the University of Southern California, obtained in 1932, and a MSE degree from the University of Michigan, obtained in 1935. The school catalog also reflects that GEORGE YOSHIO TSUBOTA is a Teaching Fellow and Assistant in the Aeronautics Department at CIT. TSUBOTA obtained a BS degree at CIT in 1937, and a MS degree there in 1938; and that these last two mentioned individuals are Japanese.

stated that it is very possible that all three of the above-mentioned individuals could gain access to both the wind tunnel and computing rooms. However, he stated that he had no definite information that such was the case.

It will be recalled that this investigation was predicated upon information as set forth in reference letter to the effect that foreigners, including VON KAPLAN, who were studying or teaching at CIT, had access to the wind tunnel where all new airplane models for the Army and Navy manufactured in this area are tested. In this regard it is believed that

CIT, could furnish information of value concerning the various individuals mentioned in this report - as well as information regarding possible access by them to the wind tunnel and computing rooms. has in the past furnished information of value to this office, and is very cooperative.

was mentioned the letter previously referred to, as possibly being in a position to furnish information relative to VON KARMAN. This person is undoubtedly

was telephonically contacted and he advised that he left CIT approximately years ago, and is, therefore, not able to furnish any information of value relative to activities of persons at CIT. The nature of this investigation was not disclosed to

subsequently advised that he learned that is a native of Germany, definitely pro-Nazi in his sympathies.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agent

was recontacted, at which time he stated that he had since ascertained that the secrecy surrounding entries into the wind tunnel building was due chiefly to keep various experiments of the several aircraft industries who make tests in the tunnel, confidential. He had also learned that the rules regarding entering the tunnel are strictly observed and that it is the most difficult building on the campus to gain entrance to. stated that it was his opinion that VON KARMAN was entirely reliable, being anti-Nazi, a citizen of the United States, and one of the top-ranking men in the field of aeronautical science.

No further information was obtained by regarding ALEXANDER GOETZ. Regarding SPIRO KYROPOULOS, stated that his original informant, had been unable to obtain any further information.

As further information regarding who contacts ALEXANDER GOETZ on the average of twice a week, stated that he had personally had contacts with all of the aircraft industries in and about Los Angeles, and had discussed conduct with the various officials at each place, pointing out his suspicions regarding and his contacts with GOETZ. No recent information regarding had been obtained other than that is still strongly pro-Nazi.

stated that GOETZ and KYROPOULOS are not known personally to him. Further that he had no reason to contact VON KARMAN in his studies, and therefore did not

know him. was very cooperative, and stated that he would be on the alert for any information indicating subversive activities or espionage - and in line with that, would contact

and request him to also watch for any irregularities in the branch of the school. The importance of strict confidential treatment of all information and inquiries was impressed on who stated that he would be very careful when obtaining information.

advised that by actual test on his part he has ascertained that admittance to the wind tunnel and access to any information developed from experiments therein, is extremely difficult; and that the tunnel is kept under lock and key at all times, admittance therein being restricted only to authorized persons, and exceptions permitted only on occasions when persons have obtained a pass from the person in charge of the tunnel.

**SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:**

Informant advises subject GOETZ a friend of Los Angeles and San Francisco, respectively. Subject GOETZ has had Japs as guests at home. [redacted] wrote letter to subject from New York, saying that she had finished the job she was sent to do, and got the information she went after. Subject receives mail from Germany on average of one or two each week. Both subject GOETZ [redacted] have made statements reflecting sympathy with the Japanese. Subject mailed three letters to Germany on Monday morning, December 8, 1941, the day after the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor. Subject [redacted] have become friendly with a neighbor who is connected with the Coast Guard.

DETAILS:

Memorandum for the file, dated September 2, 1941, reflects that on August 28, 1941, information was telephonically furnished to this office by the TWA that DR. VON KAPLAN was departing at 6:00 P.M. for New York City on the Stratoliner and was leaving on August 29, 1941, aboard the American Line, Trip 36, New York City, en route to Providence, Rhode Island.

Memorandum for the file dated September 8, 1941, reflects that on August 28, 1941, Pasadena, telephonically advised Special Agent that she had some information to divulge to the Bureau concerning a possible spy of a serious nature. She said that several months previously she had communicated with the Los Angeles Office and had furnished data concerning the activities of a certain individual in Pasadena, whose name she did not wish to divulge on the telephone. She said that at the present time she had additional information concerning the same subject but that such information was of such a serious nature that she could not reveal it unless personally contacted by a Bureau Agent. Informant was advised that she would be contacted by a Special Agent within the near future. A search of the files in the Los Angeles Field Office reveals that informant had given information concerning THEODORE VON KAPLAN, L. A. File No. 65-265.

Memorandum for the file dated September 25, 1941, reflects that upon instructions of Assistant Special Agent in Charge Special Agent telephonically contacted Pasadena, and requested an interview at her convenience. It was suggested by had certain information which she would furnish the Bureau and he suggested that she be contacted. suggested that Agent contact her between 10:00 and 11:00 on September 17, 1941, which request was complied with and furnished the following information:

That the proprietor of while doing some work for her had told her that he, while doing some at another residence had observed a divan in which there appeared to be a secret compartment, and that in this compartment there were a large number of railroad maps, reported to show the location of railroads in the United States, and that on these maps all bridges were marked.

stated that she was advised by that the residence in which he observed these maps with the bridges marked thereon was at the home of Dr. JOSEPHINE De KARMAN, who is the sister of Dr. VON KARMAN, who is employed by the California Institute of Technology. further stated that advised her that previous checks which have been given him in payment for by Dr. JOSEPHINE De KARMAN had been signed Dr. JOSEPHINE VON KARMAN.

advised that to her personal knowledge VON KARMAN was employed at the California Institute of Technology, and that he was a recognized authority on the subject of stresses and strains of bridges. She further advised that

mentioned to her that Dr. VON KARMAN had been approached by the German Government in an effort to induce VON KARMAN to return to Germany. naa

It is to be noted in connection with the above memorandum that subsequent information revealed that the maps mentioned in the memorandum were in subject VON KARMAN's possession legally and rightfully. Furthermore, information furnished by Confidential National Defense Informant known to the Bureau under Bureau cover letter dated December 23, 1941, reflects that these maps were rightfully in subject's possession.

A memorandum for the file dated October 6, 1941, reflects that Special Agent was telephonically advised by Confidential National Defense Informant No. that Professor GOETZ, who is purportedly on the staff of the California Institute of Technology, is an ardent Nazi sympathizer. The informant stated that this individual has, on many occasions, made pro-Nazi statements indicating sincere and ardent belief and support of the Nazi regime. The informant also stated that

in the same institution, the California Institute of Technology, can verify Professor GOETZ' sympathy and allegiance to the Nazi regime.

A card from Confidential National Defense Informant reflects that a review of the record of subject ALEXANDER GOETZ in their files, reveals a strong German Nationalism and sympathy for the Nazi cause, and association with numerous individuals who are known to be engaged in espionage. The conclusion is drawn

that subject would be a distinct threat to the National security if permitted his liberty, in the event of hostilities between the United States and Germany; reclassified as dangerous accordingly.

Memorandum for the file dated December 16, 1941, reflects that under date of December 9, 1941, an anonymous informant telephonically contacted Special Agent [redacted] and reported that about one year ago a Japanese chauffeur named T. KODAMA had contacted her relative to a business transaction; that he said he was employed by DR. THEODORE VON KARMAN, who is an airplane designer for the U. S. GOVERNMENT and a Professor at California Institute of Technology. This informant further advised that the Japanese chauffeur at the time he contacted her, displayed a picture of his employer, DR. VON KARMAN, THEODORE, dressed in a robe which bore a large Swastika thereon. The informant advised that DR. JOSEPHINE VON KARMAN, sister of THEODORE, had taught language classes last year at the University of California. THEODORE VON KARMAN resides at 1501 South Marengo, near Pasadena, and it is thought that his sister, JOSEPHINE VON KARMAN, resides with him. It was further stated by the informant that according to the telephone directory, T. KODAMA resides at 717 Cypress Street, Los Angeles.

Repeated efforts to contact T. KODAMA have been made, with negative results. The telephone number of T. KODAMA is SYcamore 35028. A lead is being set out to make further efforts to contact KODAMA for the purpose of interviewing him regarding the above information.

The Los Angeles Field Division has no record in their files concerning KODAMA.

Confidential National Defense Informant [redacted] advises that subject VON KARMAN is a Hungarian Jew, and recognized as one of the leading aeronautical experts in the world. When VON KARMAN received an offer from Germany requesting his return to Germany for military purposes, VON KARMAN jokingly asked Confidential National Defense Informant [redacted] if he shouldn't send them a picture of his profile. Informant [redacted] advised that VON KARMAN had been cleared by both the office of [redacted] and [redacted] after a request by the National Defense Research Committee at California Institute of Technology, inasmuch as the Institute wanted to use VON KARMAN as a consultant. Informant [redacted] advised that [redacted] investigated subject concerning the

alleged finding of bridge pictures in VON KAMMAN's home. Informant stated he was sure this was in connection with a consultation concerning the Tacoma Narrows Bridge, which collapsed approximately a year ago, and at that time he was given the maps and pictures of many other bridges to check for the same possibilities. A confidential informant advised on November 15, 1939, that Theodore Von Karman, who appears to be identical with the subject, together with other "foreigners" was studying and teaching at the California Institute of Technology, and by virtue of such position had access to the testing facilities for airplane models of the Army and Navy. The informant did not furnish information of a specific character which indicated that Von Karman was engaged in any suspicious activity, but suggested that he be investigated, as it was thought that he possessed pro-German sympathies. Other informants have advised that Von Karman is entirely reliable, is anti-Nazi in sympathy and has been active in aiding Jewish refugees in leaving Germany.

Our informant became very perturbed at this condition due to the fact that KODAMA had confided in her, at one time while partially under the influence of intoxicants that while he was in Japan he had been a structural engineer and could read drawings and blueprints. When informant called this condition to the attention of subject's sister JOSEPHINE she ignored the warning and said KODAMA was a harmless, ignorant Jap, and they had confidence in him.

"Our informant states that once a week, usually Thursday night, a heavy set, well dressed Japanese would call for KODAMA and then they would go to Los Angeles. When she asked KODAMA what they did he stated that they 'listened to Japan'. Our informant states that KODAMA is very well versed in current events.

Our informant states that she was very suspicious of these two women. but due to the fact that she was very much occupied she was unable to verify her suspicions, however, due to information in our files it is entirely possible that there is grounds for her suspicion.

we found in his billfold a membership card in The Southern California Automobile Club, issued to Dr. VON KARMAN. We inquired as to how it came into his possession, he said 'He is just a friend'.

Referenced report sets out a lead to interview KODAMA concerning information to the effect that he possessed a picture of VON KARMAN dressed in a robe with the Nazi swastika insignia thereon. The interview with KODAMA took place prior to the information received as set forth above, consequently no information was developed relative to the card which he had given

However, in view of the fact that no information was developed from [ ] it is not deemed necessary to reinterview KODAMA. KODAMA advised that he was VON KARMAN'S chauffeur and also acted in the capacity of cook and gardener. He was asked to furnish a picture of VON KARMAN and he advised that he did not possess any pictures of him. He stated that he had been employed by VON KARMAN for about four years and that he had not returned to Japan in the last forty five years, having come to this country at that time. He stated that he was well satisfied with this country and that he did not ever want to return to Japan inasmuch as he heard that people were all poor in Japan. He stated that subject VON KARMAN was very opposed to HITLER and that he has never seen any swastika insignia in the home. He said that VON KARMAN had become a citizen about ten or twelve years ago and that VON KARMAN'S sister likewise shared subject's dislike for Germany. It is to be noted that the recent alien evacuation program has resulted in KODAMA'S being removed from this area and he is therefore no longer in the employ of VON KARMAN.

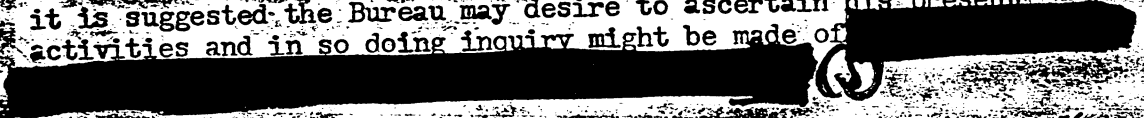
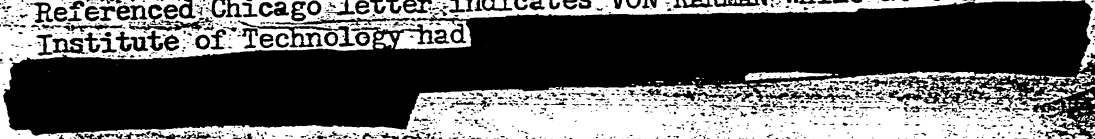

This Bureau has no information indicating that the cases of Perl and [redacted] are related other than that information which has been previously furnished you and that which is herein set out.

There is furnished for your additional information the results of a review of the files of this Bureau concerning the name Theodore Von Karman:

As of recent date, another Government agency that conducts intelligence investigations advised this Bureau that they were in possession of information concerning one Todar Karman. The information had been furnished them by letter from Vienna, Austria, dated April 1, 1948, and was originally furnished by a source evaluated as fairly reliable.

According to the source, Todar Karman joined the Hungarian Communist Party in 1918 while working as Assistant Professor of Physics at the Jozsef Nador, Technical University, Budapest, Hungary. In 1919, when the Communists seized power in Hungary, Karman was appointed Deputy Commissar of Cultural and Educational Affairs in charge of Higher Education. Karman continued to function in that capacity until late 1919 when Communists were routed by the Nationalist forces of Admiral Horthy. At that time, Karman was forced to flee from Hungary and escaped to Germany where he settled at Aachen. His membership was then transferred to the German Communist Party. Karman engaged in scientific work in Germany and was invited to lecture at the University of Aachen. In 1931 he received an invitation to lecture in the United States and was issued an entry visa to the United States from 1931 to 1933.

According to the source, Karman gave several lecture courses at the California Institute of Technology, Pasadena, California, and returned each time to Aachen after the completion of the courses. After Hitler seized power in Germany, Karman applied for an extension of his permit of residence in the United States and was subsequently granted an extended residence permit. He then became a regular Professor at the California Institute of Technology and during World War II engaged in research work in Aerodynamics for the Army Air Forces.

The source also stated that in 1945, Karman was assigned to a position on the research staff of an Army-sponsored guided missile project at Pasadena, a position which the source believed

The article states that the Aerojet Company now has a \$25,000,000 backlog of orders and is planning a new \$6,000,000 plant.

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"5. They are also friendly with a Japanese, apparently someone of high position. They have entertained him at dinner in the home and have taken him out to dinner. His name is not known to informant, although she has tried to learn it.

VON KARMAN is a German by birth, and his sister, a spinster, lives with him. He stated that she has declared herself from time to time to be a Nazi and doesn't even try to cover up.

A memorandum in the file reflects that on July 17, 1941,

[redacted] telephonically advised Special Agent [redacted] that Rooms 801-802 in the Savoy Hotel, Los Angeles, occupied by Dr. THEODORE VON KARMAN, had been burglarized on July 13, 1941, at which time a great deal of jewelry had been taken, as well as an air corps identification card issued to Dr. VON KARMAN by the Material Division, United States Air Corps, Wright Field, Ohio. [redacted] stated that this card would allow VON KARMAN to enter practically any airplane plant or defense industry.

At the Bureau of Immigration and Naturalization, Los Angeles, Petition for Naturalization No. 50558 reflected the following: THEODORE VON KARMAN, 1501 Marengo Avenue, Pasadena, occupation, Professor, born 5/11/81 Budapest, Hungary, race, Magyar, marital status, single, last foreign residence, Aachen, Germany, came to the United States from Cherbourg, France, under the name THEODORE HAYMAN and entered at the port of New York October 7, 1930, via the S. S. MAJESTIC. Witnesses on the petition were

He was admitted as a citizen July 24, 1936. The file further reflected that he owns his own home and has an account in the Pasadena First National Trust and Savings Bank. It was reflected that his mother, the former HELENE KONN, and his sister, JOSEPHINE DE KARLAN, reside with him. It was evident from the file that both the names VON KARLAN and DE KARLAN are used.

A memorandum in the file dated October 25, 1932, regarding THEODORE VON KARLAN was noted as follows: "Applicant presents German passport number 33558 in his name notated; no quota, immigration visa 1601, September 24, 1930; Professor THEODOR KARLAN, American Consulate, Budapest, admitted New York 4/9/30, Par. 2-Section 3-Act of 1924, six months; was admitted New York 9/29/31 upon presentation of re-entry permit number 704909; applicant's first entry was in October, 1926, at New York via S. S. MAURITANIA, from Cherbourg, France. His second entry was in October, 1928, at Montreal, Canada, by rail. He is unable to give the port of entry upon the Canadian border. His third entry was at New York via the S. S. ILE DE FRANCE about in October, 1930, from Cherbourg, France. The applicant states that he was an exchange professor upon his first entries."

VON KARLAN'S absences since October 7, 1930, are given as follows: Left May, 1931, from New York via the S. S. ILE DE FRANCE for Germany and returned September, 1931, same port and boat. Left November, 1932, from New York via the S. S. BREMEN for France and returned December, 1932, entering at New York via the S. S. EUROPA. Left June, 1934, and returned July, 1934, via the S. S. OLYMPIA from England. Left September, 1935, from New York via the S. S. COMTE GRANDE for Italy, returning in October, 1935, at New York via the S. S. COMTE DE SAVOI.

Special Agent \_\_\_\_\_ was advised by the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office and the Los Angeles City Police Department that their respective departments had no criminal record for either Subject VON KARLAN or GOETZ.

The Los Angeles Retail Merchants Credit Association's information concerning THEODORE VON KARLAN was as follows: Age, 54 in 1936; single; professor at California Tech., also employed by Metropolitan Water District, 306 West 3rd Street, Los Angeles, Director of Cuggenheim Aeronautical Laboratory at California Institute of Technology. In 1936 elected honorable fellow in Institute of Aeronautical Sciences, one of world's foremost aeronautical experts. Credit fair.

A credit report for Subject GOETZ gave his age as 40 in 1940 and reflected that \_\_\_\_\_ He was stated to be employed in the California Institute of Technology as an associate professor in physics. He was stated to earn \$3600 per year and to have a

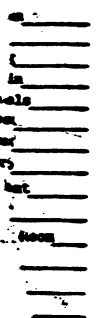
There is furnished for your confidential information the following concerning captioned individual. Reliable sources advise that Dr. Theodore Von Karman presently maintains an office at the Pentagon in connection with employment by the Air Force.

As of recent date, another Government agency that conducts intelligence investigations advised this Bureau that they were in possession of information concerning one Todar Karman. The information had been furnished them by letter from Vienna, Austria, dated April 1, 1948, and was originally furnished by a source evaluated as fairly reliable.

According to the source, Todar Karman joined the Hungarian Communist Party in 1918 while working as Assistant Professor of Physics at the Jozsef Nador, Technical University, Budapest, Hungary. In 1919, when the Communists seized power in Hungary, Karman was appointed Deputy Commissar of Cultural and Educational Affairs in charge of Higher Education. Karman continued to function in that capacity until late 1919 when Communists were routed by the Nationalist forces of Admiral Horthy. At that time, Karman was forced to flee from Hungary and escaped to Germany where he settled at Aachen. His membership was then transferred to the German Communist Party. Karman engaged in scientific work in Germany and was invited to lecture at the University of Aachen. In 1931 he received an invitation to lecture in the United States and was issued an entry visa to the United States from 1931 to 1933.

According to the source, Karman gave several lecture courses at the California Institute of Technology, Pasadena, California, and returned each time to Aachen after the completion of the courses. After Hitler seized power in Germany, Karman applied for an extension of his permit of residence in the United States and was subsequently granted an extended residence permit. He then became a regular Professor at the California Institute of Technology and during World War II engaged in research work in Aerodynamics for the Army Air Forces.

The source also stated that in 1945, Karman was assigned to a position on the research staff of an Army-sponsored guided missile project at Pasadena, a position which the source believed he maintained as of 1948. The source further believed that Karman covered up his Communist Party membership when first applying for an entry visa to the United States in 1931.

The Chicago Office of this Bureau has recently advised that one [redacted] telephonically contacted that office while passing through the City of Chicago. [redacted] advised that he had been [redacted]

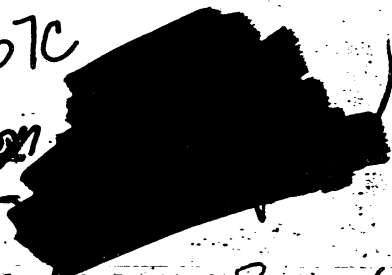

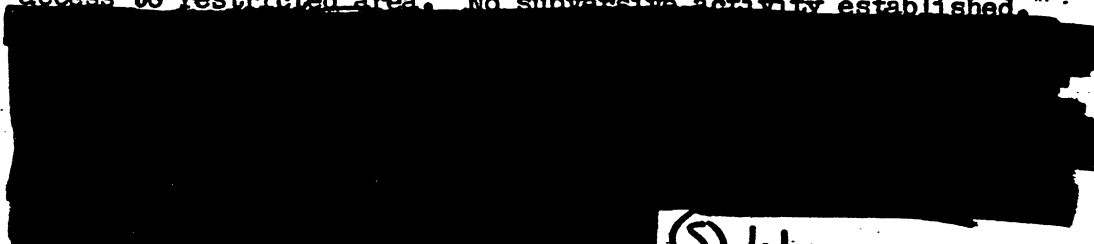

INS records checked August, 1941, by the Los Angeles Office and reflect Theodor Von Karman was born May 11, 1881, Budapest, Hungary and entered the United States from Cherbourg, France, under the name Theodor Karman at the Port of New York on October 7, 1930. Bufiles reflect Von Karman has apparently continued as Director of the Guggenheim Aeronautical Research Laboratory and Professor at Cal. Tech since 1941; that he was special advisor to [redacted] the Air Force in 1939; has served as consultant to various firms; and has held important positions with the Air Force and NACA. In 1947, when interviewed in connection with an investigation, Von Karman stated he was then Chairman of the Scientific Advisory Board of the Commanding General of the Army Air Forces and holder of the medal of Merit. His present address is believed to be Scientific Advisory Board, Office of the Director of Research and Development, Deputy Chief of Staff, U. S. Air Force, the Pentagon.

The Air Force has advised that Karman is employed as captioned above but, in view of Karman's other work, it is not known if he is employed within the purview of Executive Order 9835 or if he is serving only in some Consultant capacity.

The Air Force has advised its files contain no information concerning the above-mentioned allegations but that all available background information concerning Todar Karman is being obtained from Europe, which information will be made available to the Bureau.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the Liaison Section ascertain from the Department of the Air Force if Von Karman is an employee of the U. S. Government within the purview of Executive Order 9835, and, if so, it should be determined whether any action is desired concerning Von Karman under Executive Order 9835.

In the January 1, 1951, issue of "Time" magazine, a photograph of Dr. Von Karman appears together with an article which relates how Von Karman with four associates invested \$8700 and established the Aerojet Engineering Corporation of Azusa, California. As a result of Von Karman's knowledge that rockets would be an important weapon, the article states that the Aerojet Company now has a \$25,000,000 backlog of orders and is planning a new \$6,000,000 plant. It further states that much of Aerojet's experimental work is secret and that the firm presently has 1600 employees.

Recent Allegations received concerning Von Karman

By letter dated October 4, 1950, <sup>RAIN</sup> the New York Office furnished the Bureau and Los Angeles information which had been furnished them by G-2 who advised that in view of a news article indicating Bureau interest toward scientists of questionable political tendencies at Cal. Tech they were forwarding the information which had been extracted from their case on [REDACTED] (Bufiles negative) b7C

The extracted information reflected that CIC in Vienna, Austria, had forwarded a letter dated April 1, 1948, which contained information concerning Todar Karman that had been received from a source rated as "fairly reliable - possibly true." In 1919, when the Communists seized power in Hungary, Karman was appointed Deputy Commissar of Cultural and Educational Affairs in charge of Higher Education. He functioned in that capacity until late 1919 when the Communists were routed by the Nationalist forces of Admiral Horthy. According to the source, Karman then fled to Germany where he settled at Aachen and his membership was transferred to the German Communist Party. Karman then lectured at the University of Aachen and in 1931 began trips to the United States to give short lecture courses at the California Institute of Technology. After Hitler seized power in Germany, Karman took up permanent residence in the United States and became a regular Professor at Cal. Tech. During the war, Karman engaged in research work in Aerodynamics for the U. S. Army Air Forces and in 1945 was assigned to a position on the research staff of an army-sponsored guided missile project, a position which he retains to this date. It was the source's belief that Karman covered up his Communist Party membership when applying for a visa to the United States in 1931.

On the basis of the foregoing, Los Angeles was requested to institute a thorough security investigation and was advised that the investigation should be ceased and the Bureau advised if it is determined that Theodore Von Karman, whom the information apparently related to, is a Federal employee. By letter dated November 10, 1950, Los Angeles advised that Von Karman presently maintains an office in the Pentagon and requested Washington Field Office to determine his Federal employee status.

On December 18, 1950, the Chicago Office advised that [REDACTED] telephonically contacted that office and stated that he had been [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] also reported that [REDACTED] had told him that Von Karman has questioned [REDACTED] concerning the atomic bomb before information had been revealed to the public.

By teletype dated January 9, 1951, WFO advised that Von Karman maintains an office in the Pentagon with the Air Force Scientific Advisory Board but that Air Force personnel records show he terminated employment January 3, 1946. WFO is attempting to clarify Von Karman's status.

Review of Bufiles re Von Karman

(1). Bureau Investigation

During the early 1940's Von Karman was one of several subjects of an espionage investigation which was based on an allegation that foreigners, including Von Karman, had access to a classified area at Cal Tech. Investigation of Von Karman failed to show that he was disloyal and revealed that the classified area was adequately guarded. (65-3943 Serial 2)

In September, 1940, the investigation was reopened on the basis of an allegation received that one of the subjects was pro-Nazi. The entire case file is devoted to the investigation of that subject with the exception of some background data determined regarding Von Karman and information furnished.

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The Japanese, when questioned regarding the card, would only state that he was a friend of Von Karman's. Other information which appears in the file reflects that [redacted] had stated that a Japanese, T. Kodama, was Von Karman's gardner even though he was a structural engineer by profession. [redacted] stated that Von Karman brought home blue prints from Cal. Tech and that the prints disappeared for days at a time and that she had seen Kodama looking through Von Karman's work and at the blue prints. The file reflects that Von Karman was, at this time, a consultant for the National Defense Research Committee at Cal. Tech. (100-64877 - 65-8943)

Bureau investigation of Perl reflects that he was Special Assistant to Von Karman in New York City in 1947 and 1948 and as such was entitled to confidential material of the NACA which was furnished Von Karman. On July 22, 1947, Von Karman, while in Paris, forwarded a letter to NACA which requested NACA to send information to Perl who was his technical assistant. In April, 1948, Perl, using Von Karman's stationery, requested NACA to furnish a document entitled "Index of NACA Classified Publications." The documents are described as a compilation of titles of material and papers helpful in determining the advanced areas of studies that have been explored in Aeronautical Research. During the latter part of 1950, Von Karman was interviewed regarding his association with Perl and stated that it was almost entirely related to his lectures at Columbia University and Perl's studies. Von Karman stated he had no reason to question Perl's loyalty. Perl was also employed by Von Karman for a brief period at St. Louis on unclassified research for a private concern in 1947.

William Perl is the subject of a Bureau pending espionage investigation which has determined that he was a classmate at the

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College of the City of New York of Julius Rosenberg, Morton Sobell, and Joel Barr. Perl is known to have continued his association with these persons after leaving CCNY through meetings at an apartment which Perl rented in New York City. The Rosenberg espionage parallel is known to have been comprised principally of Rosenberg's fellow classmates at CCNY. Rosenberg and Sobell are presently in custody in New York City awaiting trial on espionage charges. Barr left this country in January, 1948, and is strongly suspected of having been a Soviet espionage agent. It is noted that on July 23, 1950, Vivian Glassman, the former fiancée of Joel Barr, visited Perl in Cleveland, Ohio, furnished him instructions and offered him \$2,000 to leave the United States and to flee to Europe by way of Mexico. At the time Perl informed the Bureau regarding this incident he denied he had accepted the money and claimed no knowledge as to the purpose of the contact or the identity of the person who sent him the instructions. It is recalled that David Greenglass has stated that Rosenberg gave him similar instructions and furnished him with \$5,000 to leave the country. The investigation of Perl and Glassman is being continued. During the investigation, it has been ascertained that Perl worked for Von Karman in 1947 when Von Karman was a special consultant for Sverdrup and Parcel on an unclassified Aeronautical Research contract. It has also been determined that in 1947 and 1948 Perl worked under Von Karman at Columbia University during which time Perl had access to classified NACA material which was sent Von Karman. Also that Perl requested certain classified material from NACA using Von Karman's stationery. It is noted that Von Karman has been interviewed both as a reference for Perl and in connection with Perl's investigation. He advised his association with Perl was almost entirely related to lectures at Columbia University and Perl's studies there. Von Karman states he had no reason to question Perl's loyalty. There has been determined no reason during the investigation to believe that Von Karman is aware of any subversive activity in which Perl may have engaged.

It is also recommended that Liaison orally furnish OSI the information in items 2, 3, and 5 hereinbefore set out in this memorandum.

(3). That upon receipt of information that Von Karman is or is not employed by the U. S. Government, the following investigation of him be conducted:

a. If Von Karman is employed by the Government, a loyalty investigation of him be conducted on the basis of recent allegations.

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b. If he is not employed by the Government, it is recommended that a discreet Internal Security - R investigation of Von Karman be conducted for the purpose of verifying or disproving the allegation that he was a former member of the Hungarian and German Communist Party. The investigation will be requested through G-2 who furnished the original allegation. Investigation of Von Karman's present activities and contacts will be confined to the use of reliable sources and discreet investigative techniques such as mail cover and toll call checks. In view of Von Karman's position, it is not recommended that open inquiries concerning him be made except through established sources until such time as his membership in the Communist Party has been established.

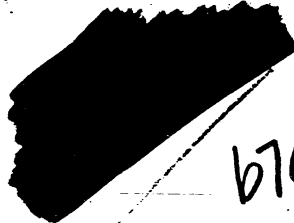

PURPOSE:

OSI advises that Von Karman is presently employed by the Air Force as Chairman of the Scientific Advisory Board, Room 4C-340, Pentagon. Von Karman is considered one of the world's leading aerodynamicists and has been employed at California Institute of Technology and United States Air Force since late 1930's. A recent report received from G-2 alleges that Todar Karman who is apparently identical with Theodore Von Karman, was Commissar of Higher Education in Hungary in 1919, and later a member of the German Communist Party. Bufiles reflect subject has been associated in aeronautical research with espionage subjects. However, no information has been developed that his association was connected with their espionage activity. It is recommended that this matter be referred to the Loyalty Section in view of subject's status as a government employee.

BACKGROUND:

Reference is made to my memorandum dated January 22, 1951, which furnished in detail information recently received concerning subject and information developed during the course of investigations involving persons who have been associated with subject in aeronautical research.

My memorandum advised that subject was born May 11, 1881, Hungary; entered the United States in 1930; and was naturalized in 1936. Since his entry into the United States, subject has been employed as Director of the Guggenheim Aeronautical Research Laboratory at the California Institute of Technology and as one of the world's leading aerodynamicists. He has served as a consultant to the National Advisory Committee on Aeronautics and as Chairman of the Scientific Advisory Board of the Commanding General of the Army Air Force. He is also a holder of the Medal of Merit.

My memorandum advised that the Bureau had received a recent report from G-2 which reflects that in 1948, a CIC investigation

in Europe determined information from a source "fairly reliable - possibly true" that one Todar Karman, who is apparently identical with subject was Commissar of Higher Education in Hungary after the Communist uprising in 1919. According to the source, Karman fled to Germany the same year and continued as a member of the German Communist Party. He then came to the United States where he associated as a Professor with the California Institute of Technology and engaged in research work for the United States Army Air Force.

My memorandum noted that Bufiles reflect that in 1941, subject was investigated on the basis of a report that German aliens at Caltech had access to restricted areas. No subversive activity was established.

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No evidence has been determined during the above investigations that Von Karman is engaged in espionage activity.

My memorandum recommended the furnishing of pertinent information in Bufiles to OSI with a request that OSI advise if subject is employed by that Agency. It also recommended that in the event subject is employed by OSI that a Loyalty investigation of him be conducted and in the event he is not so employed, that the Bureau institute a discreet Internal Security - R investigation.

By letter dated January 30, 1951, OSI advised that subject is presently employed by the Air Force as Chairman of the Scientific Advisory Board, Room 4C-340, Pentagon. They also advised that an electronic communication had been dispatched to Europe requesting all available background data pertaining to Todar Karman who is apparently identical with subject.

By memorandum dated February 3, 1951, pertinent information concerning Von Karman was furnished the Department in answer to a request by the Department as to whether the Bureau had any information indicating that the cases of [REDACTED] Perl were related and whether the Von Karman in those cases was identical. b7c

RECOMMENDATION:

In accordance with the information set out in my memorandum of January 22, 1951, and in view of the fact that no evidence of espionage activity on the part of Von Karman has been developed in the various Bureau cases in which his name is mentioned, it is recommended that this matter be referred to the Loyalty Section for their consideration as to whether a Loyalty investigation of Von Karman should be conducted in view of his employment with the United States Government.

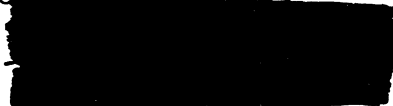

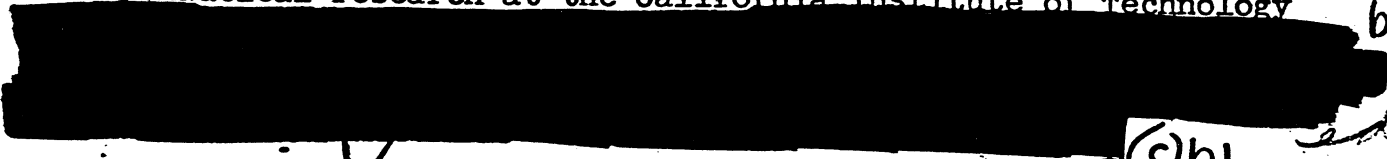

Reference is made to Bulet dated January 23, 1951, which advised that information in Bureau files concerning subject had been made available to OSI at Washington and the Field would be furnished instructions concerning the investigation of subject upon receipt of information from OSI as to subject's Federal employee status.

On March 7, 1951, the Bureau was advised by [redacted] Counterintelligence Division, OSI, that Von Karman, as Chairman of the Scientific Advisory Board, Department of the Air Force, maintains an office in the Pentagon Building at Washington. As you are aware, G-2 has now furnished information concerning one Todor Karman, which alleges that Todor Karman was appointed Deputy Commissar of Cultural and Educational Affairs in charge of higher education after the Communist uprising in Hungary during 1919. The information also alleges that Todor Karman later fled from Hungary to Germany where he continued his membership in the Communist Party. On the basis of information furnished by the Los Angeles Office, as a result of an INS record check, made by Los Angeles in August of 1941 in connection with a previous investigation of Von Karman, it appears that Todor Karman and Theodore Von Karman are identical.

On the basis of the foregoing information, Los Angeles is being designated office of origin and is instructed to conduct an immediate and thorough Internal Security - R investigation of Theodore Von Karman. The investigation is to be discreet and confined at this time to the use of such discreet sources as toll call checks, mail covers, spot physical surveillances, and interviews with established sources of information only. All reports are to be submitted promptly and are to be prepared in accordance with existing regulations concerning dissemination.

The Washington Field Office is to conduct the same type investigation of Von Karman during his presence in Washington, D. C. In the event it is subsequently determined that Von Karman spends the greater part of his time in Washington, the Washington Field Office will be designated by the Bureau as office of origin. It is noted that the Washington Field Office is presently in the process of interviewing Theodore Von Karman in connection with the

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investigation of William Perl. The Bureau does not desire that the interview with Von Karman concerning Perl be held in accordance as a result of the independent investigation of Von Karman which is now being instituted.

New York is to immediately contact G-2 Headquarters, New York City, for the purpose of determining the identity of the CIC informant who furnished the information concerning Todor Karman in order that the informant can be reinterviewed by Bureau sources or OSI in Europe for all information in his possession concerning Todor Karman or Theodora Von Karman. New York is to also determine from G-2 whether the investigation of [redacted] mentioned in New York letter dated October 4, 1950, is in any way related to the investigation of Von Karman. There is attached for New York a copy of the G-2 report concerning Von Karman, which New York forwarded the Bureau in connection with its letter of October 4, 1950. A photostatic copy is also attached for the information of the Washington Field Office.

On the basis of a previously conducted review of the Bureau files, it appears that Los Angeles is in the possession of all pertinent information concerning Theodore Von Karman. A current review of Bureau files is, however, being made and any additional pertinent information not available to Los Angeles will be furnished.

A check of Central Office records of INS at Washington is being made by the Bureau concerning Todor Karman to determine whether it is possible that Todor Karman and Theodore Von Karman are not identical. It is noted that INS records concerning Theodore Von Karman have already been checked by Los Angeles in connection with their previous investigation of subject. A photograph of Von Karman which appeared in the January 1, 1951, issue of Time magazine is being copied at the Bureau and will be furnished Los Angeles and interested offices.

The Bureau is also determining from its files the identity of persons who are known to have held official positions in the Hungarian Communist Government of 1919 and if deemed appropriate, will set out leads requesting the interview of those persons concerning subject. The results of the OSI investigation now being conducted in Europe will be made available when received at the Bureau.

In connection with his duties as Chairman of the Scientific Advisory Board he attends conferences in Washington approximately twice each year and is paid on a consultant basis.

[redacted] stated that there is some doubt at this time as to whether it is proper to investigate Von Karman under Executive Order 9835 and stated that in any event, if possible, it would be preferable for the investigation to be made under the Internal Security character. In this connection they noted that Von Karman has access to practically all classified information in Air Force Headquarters and is an outstanding technician. They pointed out that to conduct the investigation under 9835, which may not be appropriate, the information developed would of necessity be passed to Air Force through the Civil Service Commission and many individuals not directly concerned would have access to the results of the investigation.
