### SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

[REDACTED] has met subject only twice, unacquainted with his political activities in Hungary or any Communist sympathies. [REDACTED] has conversed with subject approximately four times since 1942, considers him strongly pro-Soviet and questionable security risk. Subject has admitted to [REDACTED] role in Hungary under Kun regime but discounted any sympathies for that government. Visited in Hotel room, D. C., by three Russians shortly after return from Europe, 1945, pertinence of visit not known. No record re [REDACTED] WFO.

Among the individuals present as recalled [redacted] were [redacted] and [redacted]

The evening at [redacted] was strictly social in nature, although most of the conversation naturally concerned general scientific matters. [redacted] did not recall any remark by the subject during the evening which had any pro-Communist or Soviet implications.

[redacted] stated that at this time he had been doing some experimental work in his own field and discussed with the subject the possibility of the latter affording him an introduction or recommendation to the Navy Department in order that he might have an entree with this department by which he could possibly gain a contract for experimental work. According to [redacted] subject agreed to write such a letter to the Navy; however, it was not known to [redacted] whether he actually did so. [redacted] had mentioned to KARMAN that he was doing experimentation and study [redacted]

[redacted] and that during the course of his conversation with KARMAN the latter asked [redacted] if there was any possibility to use this method in order to [redacted] Sometime later, [redacted] had occasion to travel to New York City where he visited KARMAN in the latter's Hotel room, the name of the Hotel not being recalled. The visit was of short duration and some general conversation was held between the two men in addition to the somewhat technical discussion of the aforementioned field of experimentation in which [redacted] was engaged. According to [redacted] he has not corresponded with or seen subject since this latter meeting, and that as a result of his slight acquaintance with him, he would be unable to give any opinion as to the latter possessing pro-Communist or pro-Soviet tendencies. During their discussions, he had never observed anything on the part of VON KARMAN which would lead him to believe that the latter was engaged in any subversion or questionable activity.

[redacted] stated that he had never met subject prior to 1942 or 1943, although he had heard of him by his professional reputation, and that it was also generally known in Hungarian circles that VON KARMAN had been involved with the Kun government, and that at its overthrow, he had left Hungary.

The exact details of this involvement were not known to [REDACTED] nor could he attribute such information about subject to any particular individual.

In 1942 or 1943, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] who mentioned to [REDACTED] that as both he and subject were of Hungarian birth and professional men, they would probably enjoy becoming acquainted. Subject at the time was residing in some Hotel in Washington with his sister JOSEPHINE, and they were introduced through [REDACTED] who is not believed to be particularly friendly nor well acquainted with subject. According to [REDACTED] he met subject probably two or three times thereafter in the latter's Hotel in Washington, during which time their conversation concerned general world conditions and the "old country, Hungary". The last time that they met was in 1945, shortly after subject had returned from Europe and had evidently visited Russia. At this time, as on the previous occasions, subject called [REDACTED] at his home and invited him to his Hotel room. On the particular evening, [REDACTED] went to the Hotel, and as was the custom, went directly to subject's room where he knocked on the door. The door was opened by the subject, who appeared somewhat abashed and chagrined, and rather apologetically stated that he had had visitors who had remained longer than he had expected, but that they were then ready to leave. [REDACTED] was ushered into the room and introduced to three men, all of whom had Russian names, and either spoke in Russian or in English with a distinct Russian accent. Immediately after the introduction, the men each picked up a briefcase and departed. The names and descriptions of these men are not recalled by [REDACTED] who further stated that he was certainly not in a position to state that there was anything amiss in the men being in KARMAN's apartment, although at the time, it did appear to him to be extremely suspicious due to the fact that KARMAN had just returned from a trip abroad and was, as known to [REDACTED] engaged in rather highly important work of a technical nature for this government in this country even though the exact nature of the work was not known to [REDACTED]. Subject never offered any explanation concerning the presence of the men, nor did he thereafter elude to them. Throughout his meetings with subject, the latter had always appeared to be very favorably disposed toward and sympathetic to the Soviet Union, and upon the occasion of their last meeting in the Hotel

room, he was profuse in his praising of that nation and apparently could find nothing to criticize concerning Russia.

Subject was not known to be, nor to have ever been, a member of the Communist Party either in Hungary, Germany, or the United States, but it was [redacted] impression that the latter possessed definite pro-Soviet leanings, and as a result thereof, was a very questionable security risk. The subject had mentioned to [redacted] that he had held a position in the educational field during the Kum regime but mentioned that he had never been a Communist Party member nor an actual functionary in the regime, and it was [redacted] opinion that it is quite possible that his reasons for becoming involved with the Kum regime might well have been opportunistic as well as motivated by any ideological considerations.

[redacted] stated that on a number of occasions subject has called him at his home in order to make future appointments to meet with him, but that he, [redacted] has assiduously avoided KARMAN due to the disquieting feeling that KARMAN is pro-Soviet, and that consequently, they have not subsequently met. [redacted] stressed that he would be unable to definitely prove or refer to specific instances wherein KARMAN had appeared to him to be pro-Soviet, and that other than as stated above, this opinion was based on the general feeling which he obtained from his conversations with subject.

no agreements were consummated by [redacted] with that concern.

Von Karman also introduced [redacted] to [redacted]

On August 6, 1951, [REDACTED] living at the Holland Hotel, 42nd Street, New York City, called at the New York Office with his mother. [REDACTED] said that he had previously made complaints about the above-named individuals to both the Los Angeles and Washington Field Offices and desired to furnish additional information.

[REDACTED] is an alien and came to the United States with his mother sometime [REDACTED]. The purpose of his visit to the United States was to exhibit to the American military authorities an invention which he had previously discussed with Dr. VON KARMAN when VON KARMAN was in Europe.

This invention primarily was [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] also invented what he calls [REDACTED] and he indicated was of much more use to the military authorities than his first invention.

After coming to the United States and meeting VON KARMAN, [REDACTED] was sent by VON KARMAN to [REDACTED] Research and Development Branch, Military Planning Division of the Army Quartermaster Corps of Washington, D.C. [REDACTED] discussed his first invention with [REDACTED] who attempted to interest [REDACTED] in having the Reed Research, Inc. of 1048 Potomac Street, Northwest, Washington, D.C. telephone number Decatur 7000, which firm [REDACTED] indicated could help [REDACTED] in the manufacture of his invention, look at this invention.

his inventions with VON KARMAN, VON KARMAN tried to get [redacted]  
to have the inventions developed through Aerojet, a California  
firm with which VON KARMAN supposedly was affiliated. During  
the course of [redacted] discussions with VON KARMAN, he had  
occasion to meet [redacted]

He has no specific information to substantiate this statement  
that they are Communists although he pointed out an article  
entitled [redacted] which appears in the  
[redacted]

This article was written by [redacted]  
[redacted] who notes in his article  
that the information about [redacted] was given to both  
of the above-mentioned individuals and that apparently no  
action was taken for sometime, leaving the impression that  
the United States military authorities lost many years' time  
in failing to go ahead with the information which they received  
from the German Scientist. [redacted] attempts to point out the  
similarity between the statements made by [redacted] and his  
own experience, saying that both of these individuals have  
definitely discouraged him with his two inventions and that he  
believes both of the inventions would be of material assistance  
to the United States military authorities and yet no action has  
been taken to date.

[redacted] noted that both of his inventions had been  
patented at the United States patent office in Washington, D.C.  
and that he is represented by the patent law firm of Bacon and  
Thomas, New York City.

[REDACTED] stated he knew the subject [REDACTED] the subject was a Professor at Aachen Technical College, Rhine Province, Germany. During the winters while associated with this College, the subject spent some time in the United States where he was associated with the California Institute of Technology. Sometime during the middle 1920's the subject acted as an advisor to the Japanese, but it is not known whether he acted in this capacity for the Japanese Government or for some private industry in Japan.

In May, 1928, the subject made a proposal to build up [REDACTED] for the German Government, and he later became the [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] the subject never actually worked in Berlin, but carried on his work [REDACTED] at Aachen Technical College. [REDACTED] and it was on the occasion [REDACTED] was in personal contact and associated with the subject.

[REDACTED] has had no contact with him, in person or by correspondence, since that time.

[REDACTED] stated it was common knowledge [REDACTED] that the subject had been associated with the Bela Kun regime in Hungary in 1919. As [REDACTED] recalls, the subject held the position of Secretary of the Ministry of Education during the Bela Kun regime. [REDACTED] could not furnish the source of this information, but stated it was common knowledge and everyone [REDACTED] accepted this fact. The Bela Kun regime in Hungary was considered to be a Communist one, although he, [REDACTED] stated he could not prove this statement.

[REDACTED] continued that he never talked with the subject concerning his past experience in Hungary [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] advised he has always admired the subject as a man and for his vast knowledge in the scientific field. According to [REDACTED] he has an excellent character, but whether or not he is a Communist or was in sympathy with the Bela Kun regime in Hungary, he [REDACTED] has no knowledge or way of determining this fact.

[REDACTED] stated that during the time he was associated with the subject, there were both "right" and "left" elements [REDACTED] in Berlin. Neither element questioned the other and in this same manner the subject was accepted [REDACTED]

PURPOSE:

To advise that the Bureau is conducting an investigation of captioned subject at the request of the U. S. Air Force and prior to its completion [redacted] Air Force, informed subject that he had been cleared.

To recommend that a letter of protest be sent to the Office of Special Investigations, U. S. Air Force.

DETAILS:

You will recall that the Bureau is presently conducting an investigation of Theodore Von Karman who is Chairman of the Scientific Advisory Board, U. S. Air Force, and a consultant on the top secret project Vista, sponsored by the California Institute of Technology.

Our investigation was instituted in October, 1950, based upon a G-2 report which stated that in 1919 Von Karman, a professor at Caltech was Deputy Commissar of Cultural and Educational Affairs under the Bela Kun (Communist) Government in Hungary. Investigation revealed that the subject was probably employed by the U. S. Air Force and on January 23, 1951, the U. S. Air Force was furnished available data concerning him and requested to advise of his employment status. The Air Force replied on January 30, 1951, stating that the subject was an Air Force employee.

Belmont, Mr. Keay advised that the Von Karman matter was discussed by SA [redacted] of the Liaison Section, and with [redacted] of OSI headquarters, at which time both [redacted] requested that the Bureau conduct an investigation of Von Karman and that the investigation be of an Internal Security character rather than a Loyalty type because Von Karman was employed under a contractual agreement with the Air Force and, therefore, not subject to the provisions of Executive Order 9835. [redacted] also stated that Von Karman has access to practically all classified data in the Air Force and OSI did not desire that the results of the investigation be disseminated to the Civil Service Commission, which, of course, would be necessary under Loyalty regulations.

On the basis of the above request from OSI our investigation was reinstated.

The investigation reflected that Von Karman was an associate of several Communist Party members and an associate of William Perl, a Soviet agent and [REDACTED]

Investigation further reflected that Von Karman was friendly with [REDACTED] an admitted former Communist Party member [REDACTED]

Von Karman was interviewed by Bureau agents in the presence of [REDACTED] of OSI on May 23, 1951, and on May 29, 1951, in Los Angeles, California. Von Karman admitted that he was connected with the Bela Kun Government in Hungary from March to July, 1919. He denied present or past CP membership and he denied that he had ever furnished classified data to any unauthorized person. He declined to sign a prepared statement but advised that he desired "to think it over." On September 4, 1951, Von Karman appeared at the Los Angeles Office after he was reminded of the statement which he previously stated he would consider signing. At that time he exhibited a letter dated August 22, 1951, from [REDACTED] U. S. Air Force, Washington, D. C. [REDACTED] letter reads as follows:

[redacted] also appeared at the Los Angeles Office with his mother on June 18, 1951 giving substantially the same information as indicated in referenced letter, and related a long story of his difficulties in getting sponsorship for his inventions from the subject and others. As a result of these delays and obstacles, he made loose allegations and contended that they are all Communists or Communist sympathizers, without furnishing any substantiating information whatever.

[redacted] lamented and bemoaned getting an alleged "brush off" from the subject [redacted]. He felt the same way regarding [redacted] of the International Petroleum Consultants Ltd., Pasadena, California and a [redacted] lawyer, [redacted] who he also contacted through the subject and was likewise gave him no help, especially in regard to publishing a life story of his father.

As noted in referenced letter the subject, after carefully correcting and amending a prepared statement dated May 29, 1951, as to his association with the Communist Bela Kun Government in Hungary in 1919, declined to sign it "at this time" although admitting the facts therein to be true. He indicated that he desired "to think the matter over" and agreed to advise this office later as to his final decision in the matter.

Not having heard from him to date, subject was recently contacted telephonically regarding the possible oversight in this matter, at which time he expressed a desire to come to the Los Angeles FBI Office. Accordingly, subject voluntarily appeared at the local FBI Office on September 4, 1951. He thereupon exhibited the following letter dated August 22, 1951, which he had received from [redacted] U. S. Air Force, Washington, D. C.

Subject stated that in view of the above letter he, therefore, assumed that the investigation concerning him had been concluded. He indicated that there was apparently no further need and no desire on his part to sign his previously furnished statement. It was again clearly reiterated to the subject that it was purely a voluntary matter on his part and that it was his privilege either to sign or to decline to sign the statement. It was also pointed out to him that he was being recontacted at this time merely to avoid any misunderstanding or oversight on his part in advising this office of his ultimate choice in the matter as he had agreed to do.

Although maintaining a cooperative attitude, it is noted that the subject appeared and also remarked that he was "embittered" somewhat as a result of inquiries having been made about him from former associates and friends in Europe and consequent embarrassment. He contended that he should have originally been contacted and questioned regarding the instant matter when he would and could have explained it in full. Subject was informed that this Bureau did not conduct any active investigation concerning him in Europe; further, that any inquiries made about him in this country were in accordance with the official performance of duties imposed upon this organization and in this instance at the specific request of the United States Air Force.

It is to be noted further that the subject, who still is Chairman of the Scientific Advisory Board, U. S. Air Force, Washington, D. C., stated that he has recently moved his local office from his residence where he has maintained it for some time to the former Arroyo Vista Hotel, Pasadena, California. This new location, he explained, houses the top secret project VISTA sponsored by the California Institute of Technology, Pasadena, California, and for which he is also contacted as a consultant. Subject added that he made this move in order to afford his research papers, documents and materials proper security not available at his residence.

VON KARMAN stated that in view of the above, he, therefore, assumed that the investigation concerning him had been concluded, and he indicated that there was no further need and no desire on his part to sign his previously furnished statement. It is recalled that VON KARMAN, upon originally furnishing his statement, stated that he preferred not to sign it "at this time" and desired instead "to think the matter over." However, in order to bring the matter to a logical conclusion with a definite expression of his choice, he agreed at that time to recontact this office in the immediate future as to his final decision.

VON KARMAN also remarked that he has recently moved his local office as Chairman of the Scientific Advisory Board of the U. S. Air Force, from his residence to new quarters in the former Arroyo Vista Hotel, Pasadena, California, where better security is available. This location, he explained, houses the top secret project VISTA sponsored by the California Institute of Technology at Pasadena and for which he is also now contacted as a consultant.

[REDACTED] another Government agency conducting security investigations, advised on May 1, 1951 that [REDACTED] at Aachen, Germany, had furnished the following information upon interview on April 24, 1951:

Subject had served in the Austrian Army during World War I. Immediately upon learning in 1916 that the German Army had requested his services, the Austrian Army employed the subject to develop a helicopter. [REDACTED] believed that the subject became Minister of Culture in Hungary for a short time.

According to [REDACTED] subject accepted the position only because he believed himself to be the most qualified person. Subject was said to be "very difficult to influence" and it was [REDACTED] opinion that he was never a confirmed Communist.

[REDACTED] above advised that [REDACTED] Aachen, Germany, also furnished the following information upon interview on April 24, 1951:

[REDACTED] the subject had returned from Hungary in 1919. Subject had been an officer in the Austrian Army where he had been utilized as a scientist in developing a helicopter. Immediately following World War I, subject held the position of Minister of Culture in the Hungarian Government. He was sometimes referred to as a Communist by his enemies, but such statements or accusations, according to [REDACTED] were made concerning any individual who participated in the Hungarian Government under Bela Kun.

Subject had two brothers, one of whom had been a bank director and the other a director of a secondary school in Budapest. His father had been a philosopher and died sometime prior to 1919. His mother and sister, the latter being known as "PIPE", both referred to him as "TODOR". "PIPE" was a close friend of [REDACTED] VON FAKLA, mentioned previously in this investigation.

[REDACTED] remarked that VON FAKLA was a person of poor character and morals who "utilized" the subject for his personal benefit. It was [REDACTED] opinion that subject's friendship toward VON FAKLA was activated by the fact that VON FAKLA had aided the subject in escaping from Hungary. VON FAKLA remained in Aachen until 1930, but has not been heard from since.

During the middle 1920's [REDACTED] stated the subject undertook a private project to produce aircraft fuselages from balsa wood and bakelite. This enterprise proved too costly and he abandoned it. [REDACTED] further stated that he recently received a letter from [REDACTED] of the University of Darmstadt at Darmstadt, Germany. [REDACTED] requested that all [REDACTED] write a synopsis of their enterprises with the subject and forward it to [REDACTED]

Detailed accounts of the above were to arrive in the United States not later than "October, 1951". These narratives are to be presented to the subject at the National Congress For Applied Mechanics in Chicago, Illinois on "June 14, 1951".

Subject served as Minister of Culture in the Hungarian Government for a brief period shortly after World War I. [redacted] stated that he was convinced that the subject is not a Communist and never adhered to Communist ideals. Subject returned to Germany in August, 1945 accompanied by [redacted] of the Joy Manufacturing Company, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; [redacted] now residing in Pasadena, California;

[redacted] above also advised that [redacted]

[redacted] at Goettingen, Germany, had been interviewed on April 26, 1951, at which time he stated that he had first met the subject in [redacted]. During their ensuing acquaintance politics were never discussed and he had no knowledge of the subject's activities in the Bela Kun Regime in Hungary. In 1933, during a meeting in Akron, Ohio, subject confided to [redacted] that as a result of excellent resources and equipment afforded him in this country, he would remain in the United States.

[redacted] stated that [redacted] Darmstadt, Germany, was interviewed on April 27, 1951, at which time he stated that [redacted]

[redacted] He was not aware of subject's participation in the Bela Kun Regime. He stated that the subject had been a First Lieutenant in the Austrian Army during World War I and served at an experimental institute in Fischament, near Vienna, Austria. [redacted] related also that the subject, at the time of this interview, was then in Europe and that he had received a letter on the previous day from [redacted] U. S. Air Attache, Paris, France, which stated that the subject had requested to see [redacted] in Paris on May 4, 1951.

The students were described as having completed one year's training in aeronautics, having been sent to Cal-Aero Institute in Glendale, California to learn American techniques in airplane mechanics in order to be able to maintain the civil and military aircraft of Israeli.

The Los Angeles Times of July 3, 1951 reported the death of subject's sister, Dr. JOSEPHINE de KARMAN on July 2, 1951 as a result of a heart attack suffered at their home, 1501 South Marengo Avenue, Pasadena, California. The article related that she had been noted for her work in the field of International Scientific Relations. She had been a research specialist at the University of Southern California from 1937 to 1940 and had been decorated by the French Government for her work in promoting European goodwill by the organization of Scientific Congresses during the past five years. She was 57 years old and had been born in Budapest, Hungary where she obtained her doctorate and came to this country 21 years ago. She worked in close cooperation with her brother, Dr. THEODORE VON KARMAN, Chief Scientific Advisor to the U. S. Air Force, who, prior to his acceptance of this position in 1949, had been Director of the Guggenheim Laboratory at the California Institute of Technology.

on August 15, 1952, in connection with the above matter, at which time he furnished substantially the following information:

During the course of a meeting of the French Academy of Sciences at Paris this past May, VON KARMAN again had occasion to meet [REDACTED] whom he had known from previous scientific gatherings, including the 1945 Moscow Meeting of the 220th Anniversary of the Academy of Sciences of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

After expressing his regrets to VON KARMAN on the death of his sister, JOSEPHINE DE KARMAN last summer and his failure to contact him earlier, [REDACTED] inquired if he had any other relatives. VON KARMAN responded that he had a brother and the latter's wife in Budapest and that he had been unable to get them passports to leave Hungary and enter Chile. [REDACTED] then remarked, "Maybe we can do something for you," and he suggested that VON KARMAN put on paper the name, address and personal data about his brother and his wife. No other discussion whatever took place regarding this incident. No promises, threats, bribes or inducements were made by [REDACTED]

Thereafter, on June 6, 1952, in compliance with [REDACTED] previous suggestion and prompted by the possibility of some assistance, he wrote to [REDACTED]. A substantial translation of VON KARMAN's copy of this letter, written in French and made available to the writer, is as follows:

"June 6, 1952

"Cher [REDACTED]

"In accordance with the recent conversations which we had on the occasion of our meeting at the Academy of Sciences, you were kind enough to tell me that you would give me aid in helping my brother and his wife in obtaining permission to leave Hungary.

"As I told you, He and his wife are my only relatives since the death of my sister, whom you knew very well.

"In accordance with your suggestion, I am furnishing you the address and other information.

"Dr. ~~MIKLOS KARMAN~~; born in Budapest in 1884; address, 3 Molotov Ter, Budapest; employment, retired bank employee, incapable of working.

"~~MARGIT KARMAN~~, nee ~~DUKESZ~~, his wife; born in 1895; without profession.

"It is useless for me to say I would be very happy if the Hungarian Government would allow a passport to be issued to him and his wife. I may depart from Paris in a few days and will not return until September. Will you please address any communication in my absence to [REDACTED] Paris 13e.

"With my most sincere thanks to you for granting me this favor, my dear [REDACTED] I am

"Your friend,

"THEODORE v. KARMAN"

On the same date that the above letter was written, VON KARMAN also wrote to [REDACTED] Department of the Air Force, Office of the Chief of Staff, Pentagon, Washington, D. C., setting forth in detail his above-described meeting with [REDACTED] and the action taken by him. In view of [REDACTED] VON KARMAN expressed a desire that [REDACTED] be apprised of the circumstances "just in case some special service discovers that I was in contact with [REDACTED]"

Dr. VON KARMAN explained to the writer that this contact with [REDACTED] was the only one made with him during his stay in Paris since early last fall.

It is recalled that VON KARMAN during the past year had been in Paris where he has been lecturing at the Sorbonne. He also has recently been made chairman of a newly organized Research and Development Board of NATO with headquarters in Paris and also continues to be chairman of the Scientific Advisory Board of the United States Air Force.

VON KARMAN stated that he has not received any acknowledgment from [REDACTED] of the above-mentioned letter and has not otherwise heard from him since that time.

VON KARMAN described [REDACTED] as a Communist  
[REDACTED]

VON KARMAN explained too that for approximately a year he has endeavored to get his brother, Dr. MIKLOS (NICHOLAUS) KARMAN, and his wife, MARGIT KARMAN, out of Hungary. He arranged to get two visas for them to enter Chile in view of the quota restrictions on entering the United States. The Hungarian Government has, however, consistently refused their application for an exit permit to leave that country. VON KARMAN stated that he is at a loss to understand their refusal to grant them an exit passport. He added, however, that the Hungarian Government would definitely have a financial interest in a citizen of that country who was an heir to an estate. Upon his sister's death in Pasadena, California, in July, 1951, his brother became one of the heirs, and a representative for the Hungarian Government made an appearance in Los Angeles in connection with a probate of his sister's estate in November, 1951. VON KARMAN is unable to determine whether his brother's inability to leave Hungary is connected with this estate settlement or whether it is because of other unknown reasons.

VON KARMAN stated that his brother is approximately sixty-eight years old and was formerly a director of a bank in Budapest until it was nationalized by the Hungarian Government about three years ago. He was then forced to retire on a small pension.

VON KARMAN theorized that if the estate settlement has any bearing on Hungary's action, then it must balance [REDACTED] influence, if any, in allowing an exit permit to be issued as against the monetary gain which would accrue to Hungary from one of its citizens being an heir to an estate. In the meanwhile, final estate settlement is purposely being held up locally in order not to jeopardize his brother's chances of leaving the country if that has not yet entered the picture.

VON KARMAN advised that he will depart from Pasadena at the end of August to attend a symposium at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology at Boston, Massachusetts, during the first

"You will remember that about a year ago you kindly helped me to get into contact with the Ambassador of Chile in order to obtain a visa for my brother and his wife. Later [REDACTED] was also kind enough to write a letter of recommendation to the Ambassador of the Chilean Government and the Government of Chile granted the two visas.

"However, a new difficulty has arisen because the Communist Government in Hungary consistently refused my brother's application for an exit passport.

"Last month, in the French Academy of Sciences, I ran into [REDACTED] (we both are members of the Academie, as well as General EISENHOWER, for that matter). You will remember [REDACTED] when he came to

lunch with us at the Ritz. It was the first time that I saw him since my sister died. He inquired if I had other relations and I told him that I have a brother in Budapest and that I was unable to get a passport for him to leave Hungary. He told me that possibly something could be done about this and asked me to put on paper the name, address and personal data about my brother and his wife.

"Now I should like to ask you a personal favor, provided it is not disagreeable to you. I understand that [redacted] is seriously ill and that [redacted] is the Acting Chief. I wonder if you would be kind enough to see [redacted] and tell him how [redacted] helped me to obtain a visa for my brother, tell him about the difficulties of my brother to obtain the visa and tell him about my meeting [redacted] as I have written above. I do not want any kind of permission or any official cognizance of this matter. However, I prefer if [redacted] knows about it just in case some special service discovers that I was in contact with [redacted]. He was certainly mean in the matter of biological warfare and also not very intelligent. However, I believe that he is under command of the party and cannot do as he pleases.

"I am in indirect contact with my brother and what I know of him comes to me by way of letters to my New York attorney by some underground way from Austria. I thought it was better for me not to write him direct.

"Now, dear [redacted], I tell you this story and if you think it is all right to tell this to [redacted] please go to him and give him this information for me. If you do not like the idea, I shall wait and talk with the General myself after my return to the States.

"I have not heard from you for a long time and of your plans for the future. Be sure to drop me a line to the following address:

I spoke to my informant this morning about Theodore von Karman, who is now Chief of the Scientific Advisory Board, Office of the Chief of the Air Force. This informant advised that Theodore von Karman is a scientist of world-wide fame, and an expert on "aviation balance" (he works on the balance apparatus for the various aircraft that are designed and produced.)

During the Communist regime of Bela Kun in Hungary in 1919, the man was very badly compromised, and as a result after the overthrow of that regime, he had to leave the country because he was a Communist. During the last war he was held in high esteem, and worked in high technical positions for the Government.

The informant further states that van Karman's political record in the past has been distinctly bad and objectionable, but since von Karman has been over here informant has heard nothing whatsoever of his activities. This, informant adds, might be either great precaution on his (von Karman's) part, or it might be a change of heart.

With regard to his not being an American citizen, informant thinks that might be an indication that perhaps there has been a change of heart with regard to Communism on his part, for, as informant says, if he were doing a job for the Communists in his present position or over here in any position, he would camouflage his intents and purposes by becoming a citizen.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation, in October, 1950, instituted a security type investigation of Theodore Von Karman, Chairman of the Scientific Advisory Board, U. S. Air Force, and a consultant on the top secret project, Vista, sponsored by the California Institute of Technology. This investigation was based upon report from another governmental agency which stated that in 1919, Von Karman, a professor at Cal Tech, was Deputy Commissar of Cultural and Educational Affairs under the Bela Kun (Communist) Communist Government in Hungary. The investigation revealed that he was probably employed by the U. S. Air Force. The Air Force indicated on January 30, 1951, that he was an Air Force employee. Thereafter, the Air Force requested this Bureau to continue its investigation of Von Karman, but not under Executive Order 9835, as he was not subject to the provisions thereof. The Air Force advised that Von Karman had access to practically all classified data. The investigation was reinstituted and reflected that Von Karman was an associate of several Communist Party members and an associate of William Perl, a Soviet Agent, and [redacted] Mikhail Gorin. Gorin was convicted of Soviet espionage in 1939. Investigation further reflected that Von Karman was friendly with [redacted] an admitted former Communist Party member.

[redacted] Von Karman was interviewed by agents of this Bureau on May 23, 1951, and May 29, 1951, in Los Angeles, California. He admitted that he was connected with [redacted]

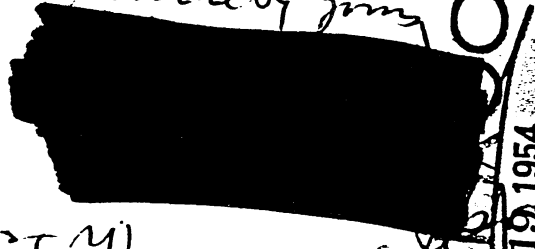

The Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) requested an applicant-type investigation of Von Karman in February, 1954, in view of his position with the Scientific Advisory Board of the Air Force. The Bureau conducted an Internal Security - R investigation of the subject in 1951 and 1952 based on an allegation that Von Karman was once an official of a Communist government in Hungary. Investigation reflected that he associated with several Communist Party members and with William Perl, known Soviet agent. He admitted to Bureau Agents during the investigation that he was an official in the Bela Kun Government (Communist) in Hungary in 1919. He denied present or past Communist Party membership. Copies of all the Bureau's reports in the Atomic Energy Act - Applicant and Internal Security investigations have been furnished to the Air Force and to the Atomic Energy Commission.

[redacted] Washington Area Security Office, AEC, advised Liaison Agent Bates on January 18, 1955, that in accordance with the AEC clearance procedures, the Air Force was asked by the AEC to obtain certain information from Von Karman so that the AEC could make a clearance determination since the Air Force had originally requested the atomic energy clearance. On December 20, 1954, Von Karman wrote a letter to [redacted] of the AEC. He referred to the AEC letter to the Air Force in which the AEC had requested a statement from Von Karman concerning certain derogatory information. Von Karman referred specifically to the request for a statement from him concerning "Alexander Goetz with whom Von Karman's deceased sister is reported to have been friendly and whose political ideology is allegedly strongly pro-Nazi."

In Von Karman's letter to [redacted] he stated that he considered the above quote an inexcusable insult against the memory of his "beloved sister." He stated he could not see what such a statement had to do with his access to atomic information.

Your attention is called to the fact that during the course of an authorized interview with VON KARMAN, on 6/28/55, re another matter, VON KARMAN casually exhibited a copy of a 2 page AEC letter concerning him, dated 10/13/54, which had been directed to the District Commander, 4th OSI District Office, <sup>WASHINGTON, D.C.</sup> and signed by [redacted] Washington Area, Security Operations.

This letter opened with the paragraph, "Transmitted herewith are copies of reports of investigation concerning subject which have been prepared by the FBI pursuant to the AEC Act of 1946. These reports are forwarded for your review and determination as to whether your department desires this office to further consider your request for clearance of the subject for access to restricted data".

At the bottom as enclosures was the notation, "FBI reports (31)".

This letter set forth an itemized bill of particulars re VON KARMAN which were presumably considered to be derogatory. These charges were subsequently answered in detail by VON KARMAN on 12/20/54, with copies being allegedly furnished to the Air Force, AEC, and the Bureau. VON KARMAN also personally saw AEC [redacted] re these allegations.

VON KARMAN was obviously irritated by these open allegations. He was especially bitter concerning an allegation that his deceased sister had been "friendly" with Professor ALEXANDER GOETZ of the Calif. Institute of Technology, and "whose political ideologies were strongly

Pro-Nazi". VON KARMAN interpreted the latter comment re his sister as meaning that she was GOETZ' mistress, a point which he vehemently denied. He felt that it obviously had no bearing whatsoever on a matter of clearance re him; was an "indecent" insult to the memory of his sister; and was a matter which he wanted to avenge. Although VON KARMAN was not specifically critical or bitter toward the FBI or its observations, he naturally assumed that the allegations itemized were contained in the indicated FBI reports, and the resentment created by the open revelations contained in the above AEC letter was clear.

The interview, however, terminated on an amiable note, and VON KARMAN indicated that he was now relieved, and that this was simply a matter that he had to get off his chest.

For the further info of the Bureau, VON KARMAN is currently Chairman of the NATO Advisory Group for Aeronautical Research and Development, with headquarters in Paris, and is also Chairman Emeritus of the Scientific Advisory Board of the USAF. He plans to remain in this Country until September, at which time he will return to Paris.

Von Karman is a world-renowned aerodynamicist born 1881, Hungary; entered the United States in 1930; naturalized in 1936. He is currently Chairman of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization Advisory Group for Aeronautical Research and Development, with headquarters in Paris, and is also Chairman Emeritus of the Scientific Advisory Board of the United States Air Force.

Von Karman was investigated by Bureau in 1950 under character of Internal Security - R and in 1954 as applicant matter at request of Atomic Energy Commission (AEC) (Reports to AEC and OSI). Investigation reflected Von Karman associated with several Communist Party (CP) members and with William Perl, known Soviet agent. He admitted to Bureau agents during the investigation that he was an official in the Bela Kun Government (Communist) in Hungary in 1919. He denied present or past CP membership.

Los Angeles air-tel dated 6-30-55 reflects that during an interview with Von Karman on 6-28-55 he casually exhibited a copy of a 2-page AEC letter concerning him dated 10-13-54, which had been directed to the District Commander, 4th OSI District Office, Washington, D. C., and signed by [redacted] Washington Area, Security Operations. This was a letter of transmittal to OSI of 31 Bureau reports and contained a bill of particulars of adverse information developed concerning Von Karman. Von Karman said he assumed the bill of particulars was based on FBI reports. He stated he had answered bill of particulars with copies going to AEC, Air Force and Bureau. Von Karman expressed his irritation over charges re his sister's association with Alexander Goetz, who was allegedly pro-Nazi. Bufiles fail to reflect Von Karman's sister was friendly with Goetz, but do reflect Von Karman was alleged to be friendly with Goetz and that Von Karman's sister was alleged to have declared herself to be a Nazi sympathizer. Investigation, however, disproved both allegations.

Memorandum for Mr. Boardman

There is no indication Von Karman received FBI reports, contrariwise, as reflected in Los Angeles airtel, Von Karman stated he naturally "assumed" that the allegations itemized in AEC letter were contained in FBI reports. Inasmuch as AEC letter to OSI referred to FBI reports, the inference arises that this info re Von Karman's sister came from FBI reports.

Bureau has been furnished previously with copy of AEC letter to OSI dated 10-13-54 and with Von Karman's reply thereto dated 12-20-54. These were received from [redacted] AEC, 1918-55, who advised that in accordance with AEC clearance procedures the Air Force was requested to obtain certain information from Von Karman so that AEC could make a clearance determination.

In this reply 12-20-54 to AEC [redacted] Von Karman made reference to the AEC letter to the Air Force dated 10-13-54 in which AEC had requested a statement from Von Karman concerning certain derogatory information. Von Karman referred specifically to a request for a statement from him concerning "Alexander Goetz with whom Von Karman's deceased sister is reported to have been friendly and whose political ideology is allegedly strongly pro-Nazi." In Von Karman's letter of reply he stated he considered the above quote an inexcusable insult against the memory of his "beloved sister." He stated he could not see what such a statement had to do with his access to atomic information.

A notation by [redacted] appeared on Von Karman's letter reflecting that [redacted] would not reply in writing to Von Karman. One Photostat each of AEC letter to OSI dated 10-13-54 and Von Karman's letter to [redacted] dated 12-20-54 is attached.

RECOMMENDATION:

Liaison should discuss this matter with AEC and point out FBI files do not contain the allegation re Von Karman's sister. AEC should be advised context of its letter to OSI referring only to FBI reports and summarizing charges led Von Karman to the assumption that alleged erroneous charges came from FBI reports and resulted in his protests and threats to avenge the "indecent" insult to the memory of his sister.

AEC should be asked to advise us of any action they take to straighten out this matter.

By airtel dated June 30, 1955, from Los Angeles it was pointed out that during an interview with Von Karman on June 28, 1955, he casually exhibited a copy of a two-page AEC letter concerning him which had been sent by the AEC to the 4th OSI District Office, Washington. The letter transmitted Bureau reports to OSI and contained a number of questions which the AEC desired OSI to ask Von Karman. One of the questions concerned Alexander Goetz and the AEC letter stated "Goetz - with whom his deceased sister is reported to have been friendly and whose political ideology is allegedly strongly pro-Nazi." Bureau files failed to reflect Von Karman's sister was friendly with Goetz. They do reflect that he (Von Karman) was allegedly friendly with Goetz and that his sister was alleged to have declared herself to be a Nazi sympathizer. Investigation, however, disproved both allegations.

It was recommended that Liaison discuss this matter with AEC and point out that Bureau files do not contain the allegation regarding Von Karman's sister's association with Goetz and that the AEC letter led Von Karman to the assumption that erroneous charges came from FBI reports which resulted in his protest.

This matter was discussed by Liaison with [redacted] of the AEC on July 11, 1955. [redacted] stated that the wording of the AEC letter to OSI concerning Von Karman's sister was in error.

[redacted] stated he had taken action to insure that the persons responsible for this would not again make such a mistake. He advised that the only information that the AEC had on Von Karman was from the Bureau's reports. [redacted] was informed that the manner in which this was handled made it appear that the FBI was responsible for these erroneous charges. [redacted] stated he was extremely sorry for this and could assure that it would not happen again. He stated that he was lodging a strong protest with [redacted] of OSI regarding the fact that OSI had given Von Karman a copy of the AEC letter which was classified "Confidential." [redacted] further advised that Von Karman had protested strongly to the AEC and that [redacted] had talked to Von Karman to try to calm him down.

[redacted] again expressed his regrets that the AEC letter was in error. He stated he would let the Bureau know the results of his protest to [redacted]. It was reiterated to [redacted] that extreme care should be exercised in the handling of FBI information so that no unjust criticism could be reflected upon the Bureau.

It is of course unknown by this office what the real purpose of [REDACTED] call may have been, but it is speculated that it may well have been motivated by possible jealousy rather than any well founded concern for the national security. Although [REDACTED] has been cooperative with this office in the past and has been considered reliable, it is recalled that she has on occasions previously called this office on nonspecific matters at irregular hours under circumstances indicating her to be under the possible influence of intoxicants. The above complaint, though given by her in a rational manner at about 5:40 PM, was followed on the same date by a telegram to this office at 10:04 PM. It read as follows:

"Please give message to [REDACTED] concerning her letter [REDACTED] while he visits - repeat visits in the States.' For [REDACTED] information, VON KARMAN does not 'visit in the United States.' The United States is him home and when he is here he is not visiting when he returns.
