12:10 p.m. Gen Cannon called from Shreveport, La. re damage to Boca Raton & Keesler Fld. He informed Gen Van that Boca Raton is damaged quite a bit, probably between 4 or 5 million dollars worth of damage. The damage at Keesler is quite bad but we are not hurt. There have been no airplanes damaged at Keesler at all. Gen Cannon said they intend to move the fundamentals out of Boca just as soon as possible. Gen McKee got on phone and asked Gen Cannon what the Air Forces was doing to help. He said the Secy of War got a report that Gen Anderson was doing nothing. Gen Cannon said that was false, that the civilians were doing nothing and we were doing most of the straightening up. Gen Cannon called on the Mayor at Biloxi personally and the Mayor was delighted with our job. Gen Cannon also discussed erecting recreation facilities for the colored troops down there as there has been an influx of them.

Gen Sam Anderson on phone. He said Gen Grunther talked to him about membership & proposes to leave it as is for the time being, that is, two Navy, one Army and one Air. Gen Anderson said he felt it was his own opinion that we should have 3 down here instead of 4 or 6. But Gen Grunther said for time being he proposes to leave it as it is. Gen Van asked Gen Anderson to write him a brief memo on this subject.

Gen Stratemeyer on phone with his list to replace Chuck Stone. List was as follows: 1. Robert Harper, 2. Gen Streett, 3. Gen Ubank, 4. Gen Schlatter. Gen Stone's new job will be Deputy Commander for Supply & Maintenance. Gen Van said they wanted to make change as soon as possible. Gen Strat would like to get out of being President of Colonel's Board due to all of this. Gen Van said he would let him know.

2:20 a.m. Congressman Rivers (S. Car) wanted the figure Gen Van thought we needed for 70 Groups. Gen Van said that a minimum of 70 Groups is needed and it will take approx. 400,000 men and about 150 to 160 thousand civilians. (Just for USAF). Cong Rivers wanted to know if the 400,000 included the women officers. Gen Van informed him we had no WACS at present time. Gen Van said that we would have to get authorization from Congress for the WACS to be in the USAF. Cong Rivers wanted to know how many women we think we'll need. Gen Van said they would replace some of the 400,000 men. Cong Rivers will put approximately 400,000. Cong Rivers is strong for REsearch. He wanted to know what the thought on Air Research was for us. Gen Van said we asked for 145 million in '48 and we got it. Cong Rivers mentioned the bill before his Committee (4035) to facilitate the performance of research and development work for War & Navy Depts. Cong Rivers noticed one provision in the bill where it said we had to commit ourselves for one year on a contract. He said he didn't think we should commit ourselves one bit because we may start out on something that turns out to be all poppycock and we ought to stop and put that money on something else. Gen Van thinks 5 years is the minimum length of time that we ought to spend it. Cong Rivers said there ought to be a provision in the bill that would permit us to terminate a contract on a moments notice & put out that money to something else that we think would be better. Cong Rivers said the Republicans did sort of knock them down on this sort of thing. Cong Rivers said he was going to do everything he could to see that we got a good Air Force. Cong Rivers asked Gen Van if he knew anything on the Russians research. Gen Van said we have some pretty good suspicions that we have gotten by piecing little bits together. Cong Rivers wants to know what Gen Van can tell him ~~that~~ what he can use on his own authority without quoting anybody. Gen Van said he thought that he could write on his own that they have a very fine project in jet aircraft and that they captured the German guided missile installations Peenemunde intact. Cong Rivers wanted to know if he could say anything about our Reserve Groups. Gen Van said they are very important. Gen Van said we figured on 27 NG Groups and about 30 Reserve Groups.
